TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The Cavaliers look for their first conference win of the season as they host Boston College
- Virginia is looking to snap a three-game losing streak
- UVa is looking for its 25th win at John Paul Jones Arena

ABOUT THE CAVALIERS (10-5, 0-2 ACC):

- The Cavaliers are 10-5 after a 70-69 overtime loss to Virginia Tech on Wednesday
- The loss was Virginia's first conference loss at John Paul Jones Arena

ABOUT THE EAGLES (12-4, 3-0 ACC):

- Boston College is coming off a 76-66 win over Miami on Tuesday in Chestnut Hill
- The Eagles enter the weekend as one of three teams undefeated in ACC play
- Boston College is making its first trip to John Paul Jones Arena

SERIES VS. BOSTON COLLEGE:

- Virginia holds a 4-1 advantage in the series, including a 2-0 mark in Charlottesville
- BC won the only meeting last season, 78-73, at the Conte Forum
- The teams have split two games, each winning at home, since BC joined the ACC

CAVALIERS LOOK TO SNAP STREAK:

- Virginia enters the game looking to halt a three-game losing streak, tied for the longest in the Dave Leitao era
- The last time UVa lost more than three in a row was a five-game streak late in the 2004-05 regular season

LAST TIME OUT:

- Virginia suffered its third consecutive loss, falling in overtime 70-69 to Virginia Tech on Wednesday
- It was the Cavaliers' first conference loss at John Paul Jones Arena
- Sean Singletary led Virginia with 34 points (12-21 FG, 5-7 3FG) and 10 rebounds

REBOUNDING SUCCESS COMES FROM MANY SOURCES:

- The Cavaliers' strong performance on the boards this season has been a team effort
- In Virginia's first 15 games this year, seven different players (Mamadi Diane, Calvin Baker, Laurynas Mikalauskas, Adrian Joseph, Mike Scott, Jerome Meyinsse, and Sean Singletary) led the team in rebounding in a game

STRONG OFF THE BENCH:

- Virginia is averaging 26.2 points and 16.3 rebounds per game off the bench this season
- The Cavaliers have had 10 double figure scoring and two double figure rebounding performances off the bench this season

SINGLETARY ENTERS TOP TEN:

- Sean Singletary entered the top 10 of Virginia's career scoring list during the Virginia Tech game on Jan. 16, moving past former backcourt mate, J.R. Reynolds
- Singletary enters tonight's game in 10th place on the list with 1,710 career points
- Singletary started the season tied for 18th on UVa's career scoring list

DOUBLE FIGURE STREAK FOR SINGLETARY:

- Sean Singletary enters tonight's game having scored in double figures in his last 37 games
- It is the longest active streak in the ACC

SINGLETARY SHINES AGAINST VIRGINIA TECH:

- Sean Singletary had his third career double-double (second this season) with 34 points and 10 rebounds vs. Virginia Tech on Jan. 16
- The 34 points is Singletary's season high and his career-high against an ACC opponent
- His 34 points are the second most in a game this season by an ACC player (UNC's Wayne Ellington scored 36 at Clemson)
- He scored 49.3 percent (34 of 69) of Virginia's points in the game, the highest percentage for a Cavalier since Singletary scored 35 of 69 UVa points (50.7 percent) at Gonzaga on Dec. 17, 2005
- It marked the fourth 30-point game of his career
- His 12 made field goals are a career high
- His 10 rebounds tied a career high

SINGLETARY CONTRIBUTES IN DIFFERENT WAYS:

- Sean Singletary is the only player in the ACC this season to have a 30-point scoring game, a 10-rebound game and a 10-assist game
- He is the only player in Virginia history to accomplish all three marks in the same season
- Singletary and Donald Hand are the only Cavaliers in history to accomplish all three marks in a career (Hand had his 10-rebound game and 10-assist game in different seasons)

CAVALIERS RECORD HISTORIC BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE WIN:

- Virginia's 94-52 win over Northwestern helped the ACC win its ninth consecutive Big Ten/ACC Challenge, 8-3
- The Cavaliers' 42-point victory over the Wildcats is the biggest margin of victory in the history of the event
- In the game, the Cavaliers made 16 three-point field goals

SINGLETARY ASSISTS IN WIN OVER NORTHWESTERN:

- Sean Singletary had a double-double with 14 points and a career-high 10 assists vs. Northwestern
- He became the first Cavalier with a double digit assist game since J.R. Reynolds had 12 assists vs. Virginia Tech in 2006

JOSEPH HAS CAREER REBOUNDING HIGH AGAINST SETON HALL:

- Against Seton Hall, Adrian Joseph had a career-high 16 rebounds
- Joseph has had double-digit rebounds in six of the last 12 games

SCOTT ON THE BOARDS AGAINST PENN:

- Against Penn, first-year Mike Scott had 13 rebounds
- It was the most rebounds by a Cavalier freshman since Travis Watson had 15 rebounds against NC State (Jan. 12, 2000)

SINGLETARY NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

- Senior guard Sean Singletary was named ACC Player of the Week on Nov. 19 after leading Virginia to wins over Howard and at Arizona
- Singletary had 23 points and eight assists against the Bison and followed with 24 points and eight assists in the upset of the No. 17 Wildcats
- It is the fourth ACC Player of the Week honor of Singletary's career

SPREADING THE WEALTH:

- · Against Howard, 13 different Cavaliers scored
- It was the most different players to score in a game for UVa since 14 different players scored in a 93-47 win over Winthrop on December 1, 1990

JOSEPH SHINES AGAINST VERMONT:

- Adrian Joseph led Virginia with 19 points in the season-opening win over Vermont
- He tied career-highs with five 3-point field goals and three assists in the contest
- His 19 points were his most since scoring 19 against Clemson during the 2005-06 season

ABOUT THE SCHEDULE:

- The Cavaliers will play 29 regular season games, including 17 games at home at John Paul Jones Arena
- Of those 29 games, 14 will come against 2007 NCAA Tournament teams
- Additionally, six games will be against teams that were in the 2007 NIT
- 23 games this season will be televised, including 15 of 16 ACC contests

HEAD COACH DAVE LEITAO:

- 2007 ACC Coach of the Year
- First Virginia coach to win the honor since Terry Holland in 1982
- 46-31 record in three seasons at Virginia, including an 18-16 mark in the ACC
- First Virginia coach to have a winning ACC record over first two seasons as coach
- Overall record of 126-100 in eight seasons as a head coach

LEITAO HONORED BY DICK VITALE:

- ESPN's Dick Vitale named Dave Leitao his national coach of the week on Nov. 19
- Leitao led Virginia to a 75-72 win at No. 17 Arizona that week

TUCKER A "SOPHOMORE TO WATCH":

- Jamil Tucker was named one of 10 "Sophomores to Watch" by Seth Davis of Sports Illustrated
- The list features players who didn't have a large impact as freshmen but are expected to have break out seasons in their second season

CAVALIERS FIFTH IN PRESEASON ACC POLL:

- UVa was fifth in the preseason ACC poll, voted on by media members at Operation Basketball in October
- It is the highest the Cavaliers have been in the poll since they were picked fifth in 2002-03

STAFF CHANGES FOR 2007-08:

- Drew Diener, UVa's Director of Basketball Operations the last two years, was named Assistant Coach in Sept.
- Replacing Diener as Director of Basketball Operations is Rick Brunson. A former standout at Temple, Brunson played nine seasons in the NBA

SINGLETARY, JOSEPH ARE VIRGINIA'S CAPTAINS:

- Seniors Sean Singletary and Adrian Joseph are co-captains for the 2007-08 season
- Singletary is a captain for the third consecutive year while Joseph is a captain for the first time
- Singletary joins Donald Hand (a captain from 98-99 through 00-01) as the only three-year captains in Virginia history

AT HOME AT JOHN PAUL JONES ARENA:

- Virginia has an all-time record of 24-3 at John Paul Jones Arena
- UVa has an 8-2 home record this season
- The Cavaliers posted a 16-1 home record last year in the first season in John Paul Jones Arena
- Virginia was the only ACC team to go undefeated at home in conference play last year (8-0)
- The Cavaliers averaged 13,521 fans per game last year in the debut season at JPJA

BASKETBALL SEATING FIGURE FOR JPJA CHANGES:

• After completing the first year in the John Paul Jones Arena, the Virginia athletics department has made an adjustment to the arena's seating figure for basketball. During the 2006-07 season, several seating areas were altered to accommodate needs within the arena. This led to an overall reduction of seats. These accommodations include seats converted to accessible seating and press tables for the media area. Additional seats have been removed from the usable inventory in an effort to improve sightlines and comfort. As a result of the changes, the arena's seating for men's basketball is now 14,593.

VIRGINIA SIGNS THREE TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT:

- Head Coach Dave Leitao announced on Nov. 19 that three players have signed national letters of intent to join the Cavalier program in 2008-09
- 6-11 center John Brandenburg (Des Peres, Mo.), who averaged 8.2 points, 7.9 rebounds and 2.4 blocks per game last season as a junior at De Smet Jesuit H.S. in St. Louis
- 6-6 guard Sylven Landesberg (Flushing, N.Y.), who averaged 25.7 points, 10.5 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game last season as a junior at Holy Cross High School and was named the Catholic High School Athletic Association Player of the Year
- 7-0 center Assane Sene (Senegal), who is in his first season of basketball in the United States at South Kent Preparatory School in South Kent, Conn.

- The Cavaliers visit Florida State on Wednesday
- The contest will start at 7 p.m. and will be broadcast online by ACC Select
- The game is the Cavaliers' first trip to Tallahassee in two seasons
- The Cavaliers have lost their last five games in Tallahassee, with their last win at FSU coming in 2001
- Last season the Cavaliers won the only meeting, 73-70, at John Paul Jones Arena

After a Jerryd Bayless three-pointer cut the Cavaliers' lead to one, Adrian Joseph made two free throws with 20 seconds remaining to provide Virginia with its final margin of victory.

For the game, the Cavaliers shot 51 percent from the field, including 57.1 percent from threepoint range, and 86.7 percent from the free throw line. Arizona shot 48.1 percent from the field, including 47.1 percent from three-point range, and 85.7 percent from the free throw line.

Bayless scored 21 points to lead Arizona. Chase Budinger added 15 points and Jordan Hill 14.

UVa turned the ball over 16 times while Seton Hal had only six turnovers. Virginia shot just 32.8 percent from the field, only 25.0 percent from three-point range, and 72.2 percent from the free throw line. Seton Hall shot 36.2 percent from the field, including 30.4 percent from three-point range, and 68 percent from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded the Pirates 50-43.

In addition to Laing, two other Seton Hall players scored in double figures. Eugene Harvey scored 16 points and Jeremy Hazell added 11.

Mamadi Diane had 22 points, hitting a careerhigh six three-point field goals, and Sean Singletary had his second career double-double to lead Virginia to a 94-52 win over Northwestern in a Big Ten/ACC Challenge matchup at John Paul Jones Arena. Calvin Baker added 16 points, his high at Virginia, on perfect 6-6 shooting from the floor, including 4-4 from behind the arc.

The 42-point margin of victory was the largest in the nine-year history of the event, which annually matches teams from the two conferences.

Eight of the Cavaliers' first nine baskets were from three-point range and the Cavaliers led by as many as 27 points in the first half. They took a 54-29 advantage into halftime. Northwestern had 11 field goals in the first half, one less than Virginia had from three-point range (12).

The Cavaliers made 16 three-point field goals

The Cavaliers made 16 three-point field goals and shot 50.0 percent from behind the arc for the game. Overall, Virginia shot 51.6 from the floor and 87.5 percent from the free throw line. Northwestern shot 35.7 from the floor, including 27.6 percent from three-point range. The Wildcats' 4-15 (26.7 percent) performance from the free throw line was the fourth lowest percentage ever by an opponent against the Cavaliers.

Northwestern was led by Michael Thompson and Jason Okrzesik, who scored 14 and 12 points respectively.

The Cavaliers improved to 5-3 all-time in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, including a 4-0 mark in games played in Charlottesville.

Green's jumper with just over one minute left gave the Orange a three-point lead (68-65). Diane scored with seven seconds to go to cut the lead to 68-67, but Jonny Flynn made both ends of a one-in-one to increase Syracuse's lead to three. Sean Singletary was fouled with 1.2 seconds left and made the front end of a one-in-one. He intentionally missed the second shot, but the Cavaliers couldn't grab the rebound to attempt a tying shot.

Syracuse out-rebounded Virginia 39-36, the first team to out-rebound the Cavaliers on the season. The Orange shot 44.1 percent from the floor and 90.9 percent from the line, compared to 40.6 percent from the floor and 45.5 percent from the line for Virginia.

In addition to Green, Syracuse was led by Flynn, who had 18 points, Eric Devendorf, who scored 16 points, and Paul Harris, who added 10 points and 14 rebounds.

Deron Washington's layup as time expired gave Virginia Tech a 70-69 overtime victory over Virginia at John Paul Jones Arena. It was the Cavaliers' first conference loss at JPJA and was the Hokies' first win in Charlottesville since 1968.

Sean Singletary led the Cavaliers, posting his second double-double of the season with a seasonhigh 34 points (12-21 FG, 5-7 3FG) and tying a career high with 10 rebounds. Singletary also moved into the top 10 on Virginia's career scoring, as he notched the fourth 30-point game of his career. Adrian Joseph added 11 points for the Cavaliers, who fell to 10-5 overall and 0-2 in the ACC.

The Hokies jumped out to an early lead, scoring the game's first nine points. Virginia rallied and took the lead midway through the first half. The Cavaliers led by four at the half, as Singletary scored 23 of his points before the break. The teams battled back and forth in the second half, ending regulation tied at 63-63. Virginia opened a 69-64 lead in overtime, but the Hokies scored the final six points of the night, capped by Washington's last second gamewinner.
