TONIGHT'S GAME:

- The Cavaliers host Maryland in their last game of the regular season and the final ACC game of the season
- This season marks the 34th time in the past 39 years Virginia has played Maryland in its regular season finale

ABOUT THE CAVALIERS (14-14, 4-11 ACC):

- The Cavaliers are 14-14 after an 86-70 win loss to Duke on Wednesday night
- Of Virginia's 11 conference losses, three have been in overtime, one by one point in regulation, and two by two points in regulation

ABOUT THE TERRAPINS (18-12, 8-7 ACC):

- Maryland is 18-12 after a 73-70 loss to Clemson last Sunday in College Park
- The Terrapins are 4-3 on the road this season in conference play

SERIES VS. MARYLAND:

- Maryland holds a 102-66 advantage in the series (UVa leads 41-39 in Charlottesville)
- Maryland won the first meeting between the teams this season, 85-75 at Comcast Center on Jan. 30
- UVa won last season's game at JPJA, 103-91, as Mamadi Diane scored a career-high 26 points

LAST TIME OUT:

- Virginia fell to No. 6 Duke 86-70 Wednesday night at John Paul Jones Arena
- Sean Singletary led Virginia with 18 points and seven assists

OVERTIME WOES:

- The Cavaliers are 0-3 this season in overtime games
- It marks just the second time in school history UVa has lost three OT games in a season (0-3 in 86-87)

SINGLETARY NAMED ALL-DISTRICT:

- Sean Singletary was named first-team All-District 5 by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC)
- With the honor, Singletary is now eligible for NABC All-America teams
- It is the second consecutive year Singletary has been a first-team All-District 5 selection

SINGLETARY NAMED FINALIST FOR PAIR OF AWARDS:

- Sean Singletary is one of 16 finalists for the Bob Cousy Award, given to the nation's top collegiate point guard
- Singletary is one of 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award

SINGLETARY NAMED TO PAIR OF MIDSEASON LISTS:

- Sean Singletary was one of 30 players named to the midseason list for the John R. Wooden Award
- He was also one of 30 players named to the midseason list for the Naismith Trophy, presented by AT&T
- Both awards are given annually to the top collegiate basketball player

SINGLETARY IN SELECT COMPANY IN ACC HISTORY:

- Against Georgia Tech on Jan. 27, Sean Singletary recorded the 500th assist of his career
- By reaching the mark, he became just the fifth player in ACC history to have 1,500 points, 500 assists, and 400 rebounds in a career
- He joins Johnny Dawkins and Danny Ferry of Duke and Brian Oliver and Tony Akins of Georgia Tech as the only ACC players to reach all three milestones

SINGLETARY CRACKS ACC TOP 50:

- Against Miami, Sean Singletary moved into 50th place on the ACC's all-time scoring list
- He enters tonight's game in 44th place in ACC history with 1,975 career points
- He enters tonight's game 25 points away from becoming the 38th player in ACC history*, and fifth Cavalier, to score 2,000 career points

(* North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough could become the 38th player with 15 points Saturday at Duke)

SINGLETARY CLIMBS CAREER CHARTS:

- Sean Singletary ranks fifth on Virginia's career scoring chart with 1,975 points and he enters tonight's game 253 points away from fourth place (Ralph Sampson: 2,228)
- Singletary ranks third in school history with 548 career assists and enters tonight's game 50 assists shy of second place (Jeff Jones: 598)
- Singletary is second in school history with 191 career steals and enters tonight's game 31 steals shy of the school record (Othell Wilson: 222)

SINGLETARY CONTRIBUTES IN DIFFERENT WAYS:

- Sean Singletary is the only player in Division I this season to have a 40-point scoring game, a 10-rebound game and a 10-assist game
- He is the only player in Virginia history to accomplish all three marks in the same season
- Singletary and Donald Hand are the only Cavaliers in history to accomplish all three marks in a career (Hand had his 10-rebound game and 10-assist game in different seasons)

DOUBLE FIGURE STREAK FOR SINGLETARY:

- Sean Singletary enters tonight's game having scored in double figures in his last 50 games
- It is the longest active streak in the ACC

DOUBLE-DOUBLES FOR SINGLETARY:

- Sean Singletary has had a double-double in two ACC games this season
- He followed his 34 point-10 rebound effort vs. Virginia Tech (1/16) with 19 points and 10 assists vs. Boston College (1/19)
- Singletary is the only player in the ACC to have both a points-rebounds and a points-assists double-double this season
- Of his four career double-doubles, two have been points-rebounds and two have been points-assists



MIKALAUSKAS MAKES IMPACT SINCE RETURN:

- Laurynas Mikalauskas is averaging 10.0 points and 5.2 rebounds per game since returning on Feb. 12 vs. North Carolina from a shoulder injury that kept him out of 13 games
- Virginia is 3-3 since his return after going 4-9 during his absence
- At Miami he set career highs with 16 points and 13 rebounds (his second career double-double)
- At Georgia Tech he had 15 points and seven rebounds

SINGLETARY SCORES CAREER HIGH AT MIAMI:

- Sean Singletary scored a career-high 41 points at Miami
- The 41 points were the most scored in a game by a Cavalier since Donald Hand had 41 vs. NC State in 1999
- · Singletary tied his career high with 12 field goals
- It is the second highest scoring game in the ACC this season (Tyrese Rice scored 46 points vs. UNC the same day)

CAREER HIGHS AT MIAMI:

- Sean Singletary's 41 points was not the only career high set at Miami
- Laurynas Mikalauskas set career highs with 16 points and 13 rebounds
- Jamil Tucker scored a career-high 14 points

SINGLETARY A THIEF AGAINST NC STATE:

- Sean Singletary set a career high and tied the UVa single-game record with seven steals vs. NC State (2/24)
- His seven steals are the most in a game by an ACC player this season

SINGLETARY LEADS VIRGINIA PAST BOSTON COLLEGE:

- Sean Singletary had his third double-double of the season with 19 points and 10 assists vs. BC on Jan. 19
- The 10 assists tied his career high

SINGLETARY SHINES AGAINST VIRGINIA TECH:

- Sean Singletary had a double-double with 34 points and 10 rebounds vs. Virginia Tech on Jan. 16
- He scored 49.3 percent (34 of 69) of Virginia's points in the game, the highest percentage for a Cavalier since Singletary scored 35 of 69 UVa points (50.7 percent) at Gonzaga on Dec. 17, 2005
- It marked the fourth 30-point game of his career
- His 12 made field goals set a career high (since tied)
- His 10 rebounds tied a career high

CAVALIERS RECORD HISTORIC BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE WIN:

- Virginia's 94-52 win over Northwestern helped the ACC win its ninth consecutive Big Ten/ACC Challenge, 8-3
- The Cavaliers' 42-point victory over the Wildcats is the biggest margin of victory in the history of the event
- In the game, the Cavaliers made 16 three-point field goals

JOSEPH HAS CAREER REBOUNDING HIGH AGAINST SETON HALL:

- Against Seton Hall, Adrian Joseph had a career-high 16 rebounds
- · Joseph has had six double-digit rebounds games this season

SCOTT ON THE BOARDS AGAINST PENN:

- · Against Penn, first-year Mike Scott had 13 rebounds
- It was the most rebounds by a Cavalier freshman since Travis Watson had 15 rebounds against NC State (Jan. 12, 2000)

SINGLETARY NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

- Sean Singletary was named ACC Player of the Week on Nov. 19 after leading Virginia to wins over Howard and at Arizona
- Singletary had 23 points and eight assists against the Bison and followed with 24 points and eight assists in the upset of the No. 17 Wildcats
- It is the fourth ACC Player of the Week honor of Singletary's career

SPREADING THE WEALTH:

- · Against Howard, 13 different Cavaliers scored
- It was the most different players to score in a game for UVa since 14 different players scored in a 93-47 win over Winthrop on December 1, 1990

- Seniors Sean Singletary and Adrian Joseph are co-captains for the 2007-08 season
- Singletary is a captain for the third consecutive year while Joseph is a captain for the first time
- Singletary joins Donald Hand (a captain from 98-99 through 00-01) as the only three-year captains in Virginia history

AT HOME AT JOHN PAUL JONES ARENA:

- Virginia has an all-time record of 26-7 at John Paul Jones Arena
- UVa has a 10-6 home record this season
- The Cavaliers posted a 16-1 home record last year in the first season in John Paul Jones Arena
- Virginia was the only ACC team to go undefeated at home in conference play last year (8-0)
- The Cavaliers averaged 13,521 fans per game last year in the debut season at JPJA

BASKETBALL SEATING FIGURE FOR JPJA CHANGES:

• After completing the first year in the John Paul Jones Arena, the Virginia athletics department has made an adjustment to the arena's seating figure for basketball. During the 2006-07 season, several seating areas were altered to accommodate needs within the arena. This led to an overall reduction of seats. These accommodations include seats converted to accessible seating and press tables for the media area. Additional seats have been removed from the usable inventory in an effort to improve sightlines and comfort. As a result of the changes, the arena's seating for men's basketball is now 14,593.

VIRGINIA SIGNS THREE TO NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT:

- Head Coach Dave Leitao announced on Nov. 19 that three players have signed national letters of intent to join the Cavalier program in 2008-09
- 6-11 center John Brandenburg (Des Peres, Mo.), who averaged 8.2 points, 7.9 rebounds and 2.4 blocks per game last season as a junior at De Smet Jesuit H.S. in St. Louis
- 6-6 guard Sylven Landesberg (Flushing, N.Y.), who averaged 25.7 points, 10.5 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game last season as a junior at Holy Cross High School and was named the Catholic High School Athletic Association Player of the Year. He was selected as a 2008 McDonald's All-American
- 7-0 center Assane Sene (Senegal), who is in his first season of basketball in the United States at South Kent Preparatory School in South Kent, Conn.

UP NEXT:

- Virginia will travel to Charlotte next week for the 55th Annual ACC Tournament
- The Cavaliers will open play at the tournament on Thursday (opponent and time TBA)

Sean Singletary scored four consecutive points in the final 90 seconds to give Virginia the lead for good and finished with game-high totals of 24 points and eight assists to lead the Cavaliers to a 75-72 win at No. 17 Arizona. Jeff Jones was 5-7 from three-point range and finished with 15 points, and Jamil Tucker was 5-7 from the field and tied his career high with 12 points for UVa.

It was the first home loss in November for Arizona since 1978.

The Cavaliers led by two (33-31) with 3:15 remaining in the first half before scoring the last nine points of the half to lead by 11 (42-31) at halftime. Virginia shot 69.2 percent (9-13) from three-point range in the first half and made all five of its free throws

Both teams made runs in the second half. Arizona scored 12 consecutive points to take a 52-48 lead with 13:25 left in the game. The Cavaliers scored nine consecutive points to lead 66-59 with 8:23 remaining to play, but the Wildcats came right back and scored eight straight points to retake the lead 67-66 with 5:12 left in the game. With the score tied at 69, Singletary made two free throws and then a jump shot to give UVa a 73-69 lead with 39 seconds to play. After a Jerryd Bayless three-pointer cut the Cavaliers' lead to one, Adrian Joseph made two free throws with 20 seconds remaining to provide Virginia with its final margin of victory.

For the game, the Cavaliers shot 51 percent from the field, including 57.1 percent from threepoint range, and 86.7 percent from the free throw line. Arizona shot 48.1 percent from the field, including 47.1 percent from three-point range, and 85.7 percent from the free throw line.

Bayless scored 21 points to lead Arizona. Chase Budinger added 15 points and Jordan Hill 14.

Calvin Baker added 16 points, his high at Virginia, on perfect 6-6 shooting from the floor, including 4-4 from behind the arc.

The 42-point margin of victory was the largest in the nine-year history of the event, which annually matches teams from the two conferences.

Eight of the Cavaliers' first nine baskets were from three-point range and the Cavaliers led by as many as 27 points in the first half. They took a 54-29 advantage into halftime. Northwestern had 11 field goals in the first half, one less than Virginia had from three-point range (12).

Northwestern was led by Michael Thompson and Jason Okrzesik, who scored 14 and 12 points respectively.

The Cavaliers improved to 5-3 all-time in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, including a 4-0 mark in games played in Charlottesville.

Adrian Joseph led Virginia with 19 points, tying his career high against an ACC opponent, while Sean Singletary added 14 points.

The Tigers used strong shooting from beyond the arc to fuel their win. Clemson shot 16-26 (.615) from 3-point range, led by K.C. Rivers, who made eight of his 11 attempts from long distance. Rivers finished with 32 points, an opponent record at JPJA. Cliff Hammonds added a double-double for Clemson, with 16 points and 11 assists. Terrence Oglesby had 14 points and David Potter had 10 points for the Tigers, who improved to 17-5 overall (5-3 ACC). Clemson's 16 3-point field goals ties for the most against the Cavaliers in a game.

Clemson used a 22-3 run in the first half to build a 36-14 lead with five minutes remaining before halftime. Virginia cut the lead to 14 before heading to halftime facing a 16-point deficit (40-24), their largest ever at JPJA. In the second half, a 21-5 Clemson run extended its lead to 38 points (79-41) as the Tigers closed out the 31-point victory, Virginia's worst home defeat since the 2004-05 season.

Virginia fouled Wayne Ellington with 2.8 seconds remaining and he missed the front end of a 1-in-1, but neither team could secure the rebound before time expired.

The Cavaliers shot 37.8 percent from the floor and 81.8 percent from the line. North Carolina shot 52.5 percent from the floor and 58.3 percent from the line

Hansbrough led the Tar Heels with 23 points, 17 of which came in the first half. Ellington scored 19 points and Deon Thompson had 12 points for North Carolina.

Singletary's 41 points were the most by a Cavalier since Donald Hand scored 41 points against NC State in 1999. He was 12-25 from the floor, including 4-8 from 3-point range, and 13-14 from the free throw line.

Laurynas Mikalauskas had a double-double, setting career highs with 16 points and 13 rebounds. Jamil Tucker added a career-high 14 points.

Virginia took a 39-35 lead into halftime after Tucker scored 10 of his 13 first half points in the final 4:04 of the half to give the Cavaliers the lead. Miami opened the second half strong and took the largest lead of the game, 72-57, at the midway point of the second half. The Hurricanes' lead was 10 points, 91-81, with 1:46 remaining when the Cavaliers went on a 9-0 run to close to within one point.
