About the Cavaliers

- Virginia enters the tournament as the No. 11 seed after a 10-17 regular season (4-12 ACC)
- The Cavaliers topped Maryland 68-63 on Saturday at JPJA in their last regular season game
- UVa is led by ACC Rookie of the Year Sylven Landesberg, who is averaging 16.8 ppg
- Mike Scott has posted eight double-doubles this season
- As of 3/9 (ESPN Insider RPI), the Cavaliers' strength of schedule ranks No. 1 nationally

About the Eagles

- Boston College enters the tournament as the No. 6 seed after a 21-10 regular season (9-7 ACC)
- The Eagles defeated Georgia Tech 67-66 on Saturday in their last regular season game
- Senior guard Tyrese Rice leads Boston College at 17.4 ppg

Series History

- Virginia leads the all-time series 6-2 (UVa leads 2-0 at neutral sites)
- The Eagles won the only regular season meeting between the teams, 80-70, on Feb. 4 at JPJA
- Sylven Landesberg scored a career-high 32 points in this year's regular season meeting
- Virginia leads the series 3-2 since Boston College entered the ACC in 2005-06

Series History at the ACC Tournament

- First meeting between Virginia and Boston College at the ACC Tournament
- By playing BC in this year's tournament, Florida State is now the only team UVa has never played in the ACC Tournament

Last Time Out

- Virginia ended the regular season on Saturday with a 68-63 win over Maryland
- The Cavaliers overcame a 13-point first-half deficit
- On his senior day, Mamadi Diane led Virginia with a season-high 23 points, including the 3-pointer that put Virginia ahead for good with 38 seconds remaining
- Sylven Landesberg scored 14 points
- Mike Scott (11 pts, 11 rebs) had his eighth double-double of the season
- Calvin Baker had an ACC career-high six assists

ACC Tournament History

- The Cavaliers have an all-time record of 30-54 in the ACC Tournament
- Virginia won the 1976 ACC Tournament
- The Cavaliers are 3-4 in ACC Tournament games in Atlanta
- Last year the Cavaliers lost in the first round to Georgia Tech 94-76

The Tournament

- The Cavaliers head to Atlanta for the 56th annual ACC Tournament
- Virginia is the No. 11 seed for this year's tournament
- The Cavaliers were the No. 11 seed only one time previously, in 2005, defeating No. 6 seed Miami in the first round before falling to No. 3 Duke in the quarterfinals in Washington, D.C.

ACC Tournament History

- The Cavaliers have an all-time record of 30-54 in the ACC Tournament
- Virginia won the 1976 ACC Tournament
- The Cavaliers are 3-4 in ACC Tournament games in Atlanta
- Last year the Cavaliers lost in the first round to Georgia Tech 94-76

Cavaliers in Atlanta

- The Cavaliers are 21-31 all-time in Atlanta (9-22 at GT, 3-4 in ACC Tourn., 5-5 in SoCon Tourn., 4-0 in NCAA Tourn.)

Landesberg Named ACC's Top Freshman

- Sylven Landesberg was named the 2009 ACC Rookie of the Year on Tuesday
- He is the fourth Cavalier to win the honor (Ralph Sampson in 1980, Bryant Stith in 1989, Chris Williams in 1999)
- Landesberg became the eighth Cavalier named to the ACC All-Freshman Team
- Landesberg received honorable mention All-ACC accolades

Difficult Schedule for the Cavaliers

- Seven of Virginia's opponents are ranked and one other is receiving votes in this week's AP poll
- As of 3/9 (ESPN Insider RPI), the Cavaliers' strength of schedule ranks No. 1 nationally
- Virginia's 27 regular season opponents have a combined .646 winning percentage
- 26 of UVa's 27 regular season opponents this season entered the game against Virginia with a .500 or better record
- 13 of 27 regular season games were against teams in this week's ESPN Bracketology field of 65

Meyinsse & Soroye Named to All-ACC Academic Team

- Junior forward Jerome Meyinsse and senior center Tunji Soroye were named to the All-ACC Academic Team
- It is the second consecutive year Meyinsse has been named to the team

Diane Shines on Senior Day

- Mamadi Diane scored a season-high 23 points in his final game at JPJA in Virginia's 68-63 win over Maryland last Saturday
- Diane went 7-12 from the floor (3-4 3FG) and 6-7 from the line
- His 3-pointer with 38 seconds remaining broke a 61-61 tie and gave the Cavaliers the lead for good

Diane Closes in on 1,000 Points

- Mamadi Diane enters the ACC Tournament with 998 career points
- With two points, he will become the 42nd player in Virginia history to score 1,000 career points

Bench Production

- Virginia has gotten solid production from its bench this season, averaging 25.4 points, 12.4 rebounds and 4.1 assists per game off the bench
- Virginia had 51 points off the bench against USF, the most bench points in a game for the Cavaliers since scoring 52 off the bench against Maryland on March 1, 1986
- Against Clemson on Feb. 15, the Cavaliers got 46 points, 19 rebounds and 11 assists off the bench
- This season the Cavaliers have gotten 29 double-digit scoring performances off the bench

Youth is Served

- Freshmen and Sophomores have made 86 of the 135 starts this season for the Cavaliers
- \bullet Freshmen and Sophomores have scored 47.3 ppg (67.4 % of offense) and average 22.0 rebounds a game (67.2 % of team total)
- Freshmen and Sophomores have led the team in scoring in 21 of 27 games this season and led the team in rebounding in 24 of 27 games this season

Farrakhan on the Line

- Mustapha Farrakhan is 18-18 this season from the free throw line
- His 18 consecutive made free throws to open a season is the second longest streak in school history (Jeff Lamp made his first 32 free throw attempts in 1980-81)

Free Throw Streaks

- Mustapha Farrakhan has made 19 consecutive free throws (dating back to last season)
- Calvin Baker has made 18 consecutive free throws (last miss vs. Boston College 2/4)
- Sylven Landesberg (26) and Mike Scott (12) have also had double-digit consecutive made free throws streaks for Virginia this season

Jeff Jones Steps Up

- Jeff Jones has scored at least eight points in nine of the past 10 games
- At North Carolina, he scored an ACC career-high 19 points
- He has started the last nine games
- Over the past 10 games he is averaging 10.1 points per game

Landesberg Named ACC Rookie of the Week ... Again

- Sylven Landesberg was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on Feb. 16, the sixth time he has received the honor (also on Nov. 17, Nov. 24, Dec. 22, Dec. 30 and Jan. 12)
- He is tied for the third most ACC Rookie of the Week awards in conference history with UNC's Brendan Wright, Duke's Luol Deng, Maryland's Joe Smith, UVa's Bryant Stith, and UNC's Sam Perkins
- Only UNC's Tyler Hansbrough and GT's Kenny Anderson (each 10 times) have won the award more

Landesberg Explodes for 32 vs. Boston College

- Sylven Landesberg scored a career-high 32 points vs. Boston College on Feb. 4
- His 32 points tied the UVa freshman scoring record against an ACC opponent that Ralph

Sampson set when he scored 32 vs. Clemson in 1980

- His 32 points were the most by a freshman in an ACC game since Tyler Hansbrough scored 40 against Miami in 2006
- It was only the fourth 30-point game by a Virginia freshman in school history

Landesberg's 20-Point Games

- Sylven Landesberg has 12 20-point games this season, setting a new UVa freshman record
- He has double the 20-point games (12) than the rest of the conference's freshmen combined (six)
- Only North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough (14) had more 20-point games as a freshman in the ACC over the past 10 years than Landesberg
- He scored 20 points at Duke, becoming the first ACC freshman to score 20 points at Cameron Indoor Stadium since Hansbrough (27 pts) in 2006
- With 28 points vs. VMI, 21 points vs. USF and 22 points vs. Radford, Landesberg became the first Cavalier freshman to open his career with three 20-point games
- He was only the second freshman in ACC history to score at least 20 points in the first three games of his career (Georgia Tech's Kenny Anderson scored at least 20 points in his first six career games in 1989-90)

Landesberg Makes Immediate Impact

- At 16.8 ppg, Sylven Landesberg is the ninth-leading scorer in the ACC and the third-leading freshman scorer in the nation
- At Georgia Tech, Landesberg scored 26 points, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his ACC debut (previous record was 22 by Roger Mason, Jr. vs. Duke in 1999-00)
- Landesberg scored in double figures in the first eight games of the season, the second longest streak by a UVa freshman to open a career
- He was the first Cavalier freshman since Tom Sheehey in 1983-84 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first three games of the season

Getting to the Line

- Sylven Landesberg ranks fifth in the ACC with 6.6 free throw attempts per game
- Landesberg has made 17 "old-fashioned" three-point plays this season (the rest of the team has combined for 13)
- That figure is more than Sean Singletary's team-leading 13 "and one" plays last season
- Against Florida State on Jan. 24, Landesberg tied an ACC freshman record and tied for the second best performance at the free throw line in school history with his 14-14 performance

Landesberg Shines In Collegiate Debut

- Sylven Landesberg had 28 points in the seasonopener against VMI, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his debut
- •The previous record was 24 points set by Jeff Lamp in his debut against James Madison on Nov. 25, 1977
- Landesberg's 28 points are tied for the second most in ACC history by a freshman in his first game
- Landesberg is one of only four Cavalier first-years to score 20 points in his first collegiate game
- He is the first Cavalier freshman to lead the team in scoring in a season opener since Mamadi Diane had 17 points in the 2005-06 season opening win over Liberty

Sylven Landesberg scored 28 points, grabbed eight rebounds and had eight assists, and Mike Scott added career highs of 26 points and 18 rebounds to lead Virginia to a season-opening 107-97 victory over VMI at John Paul Jones Arena. Mamadi Diane and Jamil Tucker each added 14 points, and Sammy Zeglinski scored 11 points for the Cavaliers. The victory was the 11th consecutive season-

opening victory for Virginia.

Landesberg's 28 points are the most by a Virginia freshman in his collegiate debut and tied for the second most by an ACC freshman in his first

Scott tied a school record with 10 offensive rebounds and his 18 total rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds against Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003.

A 28-9 run gave Virginia a 36-19 lead with 10:14 left to play in the first half, but the Keydets rallied to cut the UVa lead to 51-45 at halftime. Scott had 14 first half points for the Cavaliers, Landesberg had 13 and Tucker 10.

The game was tied 82-82 with 6:47 to play when Virginia went on a 10-2 run to take control of the game. A jumper by Scott gave Virginia the lead for good at 84-82 with 6:30 remaining and two three-pointers by Jeff Jones completed the run. VMI didn't get closer than four points the rest of the game.

The Cavaliers shot 54.4 percent (43-79) from the field, out-rebounded the Keydets 50-35 and had 24 assists. VMI shot 46.8 percent (37-79) from the field, 93.3 percent (14-15) from the free throw line and had 15 steals. Virginia shot 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line.

Twin brothers Chavis and Travis Holmes led VMI. Chavis Holmes scored a game-high 31 points and Travis Holmes had 20 points. Austin Kenon added 18 points, while Willie Bell and Keith Gabriel each scored 14 points.

"With so many possessions, it is a difficult style to play against. It affected everything that we do: our lineups, holding the big guys out because it would be very difficult for them to guard on the perimeter. They play you against yourself, and it was a difficult preparation for us getting us ready to go against what we do every day, so I'm just glad that fortunately we won." - Dave Leitao

Sylven Landesberg scored on a layup with 13 seconds left in the game to give Virginia the lead for good at 76-75 and then added a free throw six seconds later to account for the final margin of victory as the Cavaliers defeated the University of South Florida 77-75 at John Paul Jones Arena.

Landesberg finished with a team-high 21 points and also had four rebounds and three steals. He is the first Virginia freshman since Gary Forbes in 2003-04 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first two games of the season.

Jamil Tucker added a career-high 15 points for the Cavaliers and led the team with seven rebounds. Mamadi Diane added 13 points, while Mike Scott scored 10 points and had six rebounds.

USF jumped out to a 10-2 lead 5:01 into the game, but UVa battled back and to tie the game 34-34 at halftime. Dominique Jones scored 13 points in the first half for USF and Diane had 10 first half points for the Cavaliers.

Virginia trailed by as many as six points in the second half (61-55 with 9:06 to play) before rallying for the victory. Landesberg and Tucker each scored 12 points in the second half to lead UVa.

The Cavaliers shot 40.3 percent (27-67) from the field, including 26.3 percent (5-19) from three-point range, and 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line. Virginia had eight steals and turned the ball over only 10 times in the game. USF shot 49.2 percent (32-65) from the field, including 33.3 percent (5-15) from three-point range, and 50 percent (6-12) from the free throw line. The Bulls turned the ball over 14 times.

Jones finished with a game-high 23 points to lead USF and Jesus Verdejo scored 22 points. Chris Howard scored 12 points for the Bulls and Alex Rivas Sanchez added 10 points and nine rebounds.

"Without playing particularly well today, we still were able to win. And were able do it a little bit 'gutty'. In the last five minutes, we were finally getting some stops that we weren't successful in stringing together in the previous 35 (minutes). Jamil Tucker's three-point field goal with 14.7 seconds left in regulation forced overtime and Calvin Baker's driving layup with 10.3 seconds remaining in the overtime period put Virginia ahead for good as the Cavaliers won their Atlantic Coast Conference opener 88-84 at Georgia Tech.

Virginia led by as many as 11 points in the first half after jumping to a 17-6 lead 4:09 into the game. The Cavaliers were ahead by seven (44-37) at halftime behind 14 first-half points by Sylven Landesberg and 10 by Mustapha Farrakhan.

Georgia Tech opened the second half with a 9-0 run to take the lead and the Yellow Jackets led by as many as five points (69-64) with 3:45 left in regulation before the Cavaliers rallied to send the game to overtime.

Landesberg finished with a game-high total of 26 points, and he also had six rebounds and five assists. Tucker tied his career high with 15 points and had six rebounds, Baker had 13 points and Farrakhan scored a career-high 12 points. Mike Scott had his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Virginia shot 44.3 percent (31-70) from the field, including 39.1 percent (9-23) from three-point range, and 77.3 percent (17-22) from the free throw line.

Gani Lawal led Georgia Tech with 21 points and nine rebounds, while Lewis Clinch and Iman Shumpert each scored 18 points. Alade Aminu had a double-double for the Yellow Jackets with 13 points and 12 rebounds.

Georgia Tech shot 43.1 percent (31-72) from the field, including 33.3 percent (6-18) from three-point range, but the Yellow Jackets made only 48.5 percent (16-33) of their free throw attempts. Georgia Tech out-rebounded Virginia 50-42 and the Yellow Jackets had 20 offensive rebounds.

It was the first overtime victory for the Cavaliers on an opponent's home court since an 84-82 double overtime win at NC State on Feb. 8, 1996.

"It was a terrific game, both teams played well and played to their strengths. They got a lot of inside scoring and attacked the glass. We were able to spread them out offensively and attack. They made some runs, we made some runs and the last two minutes before overtime, with the game hanging in the balance, some of our guys stepped up. To finish it off in overtime was huge. Maryland built a 15-point halftime lead and then held off a second half Virginia rally to defeat the Cavaliers 84-78 in College Park, Md.

The Terrapins used a 17-5 run over the last 6:46 of the first half to lead by as many as 17 points (45-28) with 1:16 remaining in the half and by a score of 45-30 at halftime. The Cavaliers chipped away at the Maryland lead in the second half and got within two points (65-63) with 5:05 left to play. The Terrapins then went on a 9-2 run to build their lead back to nine points (74-65) with 2:20 remaining and Virginia could get no closer than four points the rest of the way.

Jamil Tucker scored a career-high 21 points on 7-12 shooting from the field, including 4-6 from three-point range, and he made all three of his free throw attempts to lead the Cavaliers. Mike Scott had his sixth double-double of the season for Virginia with 16 points and 10 rebounds, and Calvin Baker added 16 points. Scott made all 10 of his free throw attempts. Sylven Landesberg had a careerhigh 11 rebounds for the Cavaliers.

Virginia shot 45.8 percent (27-59) from the field, including 30.0 percent (6-20) from three-point range, and a season-high 85.7 percent (18-21) from the free throw line.

Adrian Bowie and Landon Milbourne led four Maryland players in double figures in scoring with 17 points each. Greivis Vasquez added 16 points and Eric Hayes had 10 points and 11 assists for the

"It's not going to be a situation that's productive to winning when you dig a hole as we did in the beginning of the game and throughout the first half. Florida State held Virginia to three field goals, 16 points and 13.6 percent (3-22) shooting from the field in the first half in building a 14-point halftime lead (30-16) and the Seminoles went on to a 73-62 victory over the Cavaliers at John Paul Jones Arena.

Flórida State took control of the game with a 14-0 run over a 6:24 stretch of the first half to build a 24-5 lead with 6:40 remaining in the half. The Seminoles led by as many as 21 points in the second half. The Cavaliers' 16 first half points were the fewest

The Cavaliers' 16 first half points were the fewest they'd scored before halftime since scoring 15 against Connecticut on Nov. 29, 1993, at University Hall. Virginia's three first half field goals were the fewest in a half for the Cavaliers since they made three field goals in the second half at NC State on Feb. 19, 1997.

The closest UVa got to the Seminoles in the second half was the final margin of 11 points.

Sylven Landesberg scored a game-high 24 points and had six rebounds to lead the Cavaliers. It was his ninth 20-point game of the season, tying Virginia's freshman record. Landesberg made all 14 of his free throw attempts in the game, tying for the second best perfect game from the line in UVa history.

Jamil Tucker was the only other UVa player to score in double figures with 10 points. It was Tucker's third consecutive double figure scoring effort, the longest streak of his career.

Virginia shot 35.4 percent (17-48) from the field for the game, including 28.6 percent (4-14) from three-point range, and the Cavaliers made 80.0 percent (24-30) of their free throw attempts.

Toney Douglas led Florida State with 21 points and Solomon Alabi added 10.

Florida State shot 50.0 percent (27-54) from the field, including 53.3 percent (8-15) from three-point range, and 84.6 percent (11-13) from the free throw line.

Mike Scott was the only other Virginia player to score in double figures with 10 points. It was the eighth time in the last nine games Scott scored in double figures.

Virginia shot 42.9 percent (21-49) from the field, including 25.0 percent (3-12) from three-point range, and 69.2 percent (9-13) from the free throw line in the game.

Henderson finished with 18 points and four assists to lead Duke. Smith scored 15 points and Jon Scheyer had 11 points and a game-high seven rebounds for the Blue Devils.

Duke shot 46.3 percent (31-67) from the field, including 33.3 percent (9-27) from three-point range, and 57.1 percent (8-14) from the free throw line.

The loss was the fifth in a row for the Cavaliers.

"Simply stated, we played a team that is obviously very good, very talented, and very experienced and on a bit of a mission. Whether it's what they are trying to do with the season or coming off of their last game, they focused on some very specific things to make their train run smoothly. Missed assignments on both offense and defense early really set a bad tone that caused us to turn over the ball a number of times and caused us to have a number of unforced turnovers that obviously equated to us having 17 at halftime. Clemson took an early three-point lead in the overtime period before a 6-0 Virginia run gave the Cavaliers the lead for good at 80-77 with 2:53 left to play.

In addition to Landesberg's 23 points, the Cavaliers got 18 points and 10 rebounds from Mike Scott, 15 points from Sammy Zeglinski, 12 points from Jeff Jones and 11 points from Jamil Tucker. The doubledouble was Scott's seventh of the season.

Virginia shot 53.1 percent (34-64) from the field, including 46.7 percent (7-15) from three-point range, and 62.5 percent (10-16) from the free throw line for

Öglesby scored 17 points to lead four Clemson players in double figures in scoring. Trevor Booker scored 16 points and had seven rebounds, Rivers scored 15 points and Demontez Stitt added 12 points. The Tigers' Raymond Sykes had a game-high 11 rebounds.

Clemson shot 43.1 percent (28-65) from the field, including 34.6 percent (9-26) from three-point range, and 76.2 percent (16-21) from the free throw line.

Mamadi Diane made a three-point basket to break a 61-61 tie with 38 seconds remaining in the game and Virginia players made four free throws in the final 11 seconds as the Cavaliers defeated Maryland 68-63 on Senior Day at John Paul Jones Arena.

The Terrapins rallied from seven points down (59-52) with 2:56 left in the game to tie the score at 61-61 on a three-pointer by Eric Hayes with 1:46 remaining. Diane then hit his three-point basket, and Mike Scott and Calvin Baker both made two free throws as the Cavaliers secured the victory.

Virginia trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half. Maryland led 21-8 with 6:11 left in the first half before the Cavaliers rallied. UVa scored 11 consecutive points in a span of just 1:39, four of them by Diane, to cut the Terrapins' lead to 21-19 with 4:18 remaining in the half. Maryland led 27-26 at halftime.

It marked the first time this season Virginia won after trailing by double figures.

Diane, one of two seniors on the UVa roster, scored a season-high 23 points in his final game at JPJA to lead the Cavaliers. Sylven Landesberg scored 14 points and had four rebounds, and Mike Scott had his eighth double-double of the season with 11 points and 11 rebounds.

Virginia shot 45.7 percent (21-46) from the field, including 42.9 percent (6-14) from three-point range, and 83.3 percent (20-24) from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded the Terrapins 36-27.

Greivis Vasquez scored 21 points, had six assists and five rebounds to lead Maryland. Dave Neal had 15 points and Landon Milbourne added 10 points and six

The Terrapins shot 40.9 percent (27-66) from the field, including 22.7 percent (5-22) from three-point range, and 66.7 percent (4-6) from the free throw line.

The game was the final game of the 2008-09 regular season for both teams.

"I just told the team that when that 3-pointer went up the first thing I said was 'poetic justice' and two, that 'God works in mysterious ways. There was no better way to finish off one's career and season. Obviously we needed Mamadi's performance – it was timely and I think that not only Mo, but the rest of the team talked about the need to play with a higher energy level and I think we did that for the majority of the game" - Dave Leiten.
