- UVa is led by ACC Rookie of the Year candidate Sylven Landesberg, who is averaging 17.4 ppg
- Mike Scott has posted seven double-doubles this season
- As of 3/2 (ESPN Insider RPI), the Cavaliers' strength of schedule ranks No. 3 nationally

# **About the Tigers**

- Clemson is 22-6 this season (8-6 ACC) after a 73-66 loss at Florida State on Saturday
- The Tigers are 12-3 this season at Littlejohn Coliseum
- Junior forward/center Trevor Booker leads Clemson at 15.2 ppg and 9.5 rpg

# **Series History**

- Virginia leads 66-48 (Clemson leads 31-21 in Clemson)
- The Cavaliers won the first meeting this season, 85-81 in OT on Feb. 15 at JPJA, snapping Virginia's eight-game losing streak
- In the last meeting in Clemson, UVa went on a 15-0 run over the final 5:05 to rally for a 64-63 win over the Tigers on Jan. 28, 2007

# **Difficult Schedule for the Cavaliers**

- Seven of Virginia's opponents are ranked and one other is receiving votes in this week's AP poll
- As of 3/2 (ESPN Insider RPI), the Cavaliers' strength of schedule ranks No. 3 nationally
- Virginia's first 25 opponents have a combined .643 winning percentage

• 25 of UVa's first 26 opponents this season entered the game against the Virginia with a .500 or better record

• 15 of 27 regular season games are against teams in this week's ESPN Bracketology field of 65

### Last Time Out

- Virginia lost 70-60 to #13 Wake Forest on Saturday
- Calvin Baker led Virginia with 13 points, his fourth consecutive double-figure game
- Mamadi Diane had 12 points and Sylven Landesberg added 10 points

### **Bench Production**

- Virginia has gotten solid production from its bench this season, averaging 25.6 points, 12.1 rebounds and 4.2 assists per game off the bench
- Virginia had 51 points off the bench against USF, the most bench points in a game for the Cavaliers since scoring 52 off the bench against Maryland on March 1, 1986
- Against Clemson, the Cavaliers got 46 points, 19 rebounds and 11 assists off the bench
- This season the Cavaliers have gotten 27 double-digit scoring performances off the bench
- In the last five games, Virginia has outscored its opponents off the bench 145-88

### Youth is Served

- Freshmen and Sophomores have made 82 of the 125 starts this season for the Cavaliers
- Freshmen and Sophomores have scored 48.5 ppg (68.5 % of offense) and average 22.3 rebounds a game (67.4 % of team total)

• Freshmen and Sophomores have led the team in scoring in 21 of 25 games this season and led the team in rebounding in 22 of 25 games this season

# Deja Vu Against Clemson in the First Meeting

UVa snapped an eight-game losing streak with its overtime win against No. 12 Clemson on Feb. 15
The last time Virginia had an eight game losing streak was in 1997-98, when the Cavaliers snapped it with a four-point overtime win against Clemson

• Sylven Landesberg played all 45 minutes of the Feb. 15 game, the first Cavalier to play all 45 minutes of an overtime game since Curtis Staples played all 45 minutes of the Clemson game in 1998

### **Return to Sene-der**

• Freshman center Assane Sene leads Virginia with 34 blocks this season, although he has missed five games

- He has twice had four blocks in a game (vs. Auburn, at Virginia Tech)
- Last season, Mamadi Diane led Virginia with 22 blocks over a 33-game season
- Sene averages 1.7 blocks per game, which ranks fourth in the ACC

### Farrakhan on the Line

• Mustapha Farrakhan is 18-18 this season from the free throw line

• His 18 consecutive made free throws to open a season is the second longest streak in school history (Jeff Lamp made his first 32 free throw attempts in 1980-81)

#### **Free Throw Streaks**

- Mustapha Farrakhan has made 19 consecutive free throws (dating back to last season)
- Calvin Baker has made 14 consecutive free throws (last miss vs. Boston College 2/4)
- Sylven Landesberg (26) and Mike Scott (12) have also had double-digit consecutive made free throws streaks for Virginia this season

### <u>Jeff Jones Steps Up</u>

- Jeff Jones has scored at least eight points in each of the past eight games
- At North Carolina, he scored an ACC career-high 19 points
- He has started the last seven games
- Over the past eight games he is averaging 11.3 points per game

### Landesberg Named ACC Rookie of the Week ... Again

• Sylven Landesberg was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on Feb. 16, the sixth time he has received the honor (also on Nov. 17, Nov. 24, Dec. 22, Dec. 30 and Jan. 12)

• He is tied for the third most ACC Rookie of the Week awards in conference history with UNC's Brendan Wright, Duke's Luol Deng, Maryland's Joe Smith, UVa's Bryant Stith, and UNC's Sam Perkins

• Only UNC's Tyler Hansbrough and GT's Kenny Anderson (each 10 times) have won the award more

# Landesberg Explodes for 32 vs. Boston College

# Sylven Landesberg scored a career-high 32 points vs. **30-Point Games by Virginia Freshmen**

- Boston College on Feb. 4
- His 32 points tied the UVa freshman scoring record
- against an ACC opponent that Ralph

Sampson set when he scored 32 vs. Clemson in 1980 • His 32 points were the most by a freshman in an ACC

game since Tyler Hansbrough scored 40 against Miami in 2006

It was only the fourth 30-point game by a Virginia freshman in school history

# Landesberg's 20-Point Games

Sylven Landesberg has 12 20-point games this season, setting a new UVa freshman record
He has more than double the 20-point games (12) than the rest of the conference's freshmen combined (five)

• Only North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough (14) had more 20-point games as a freshman in the ACC over the past 10 years than Landesberg

• He scored 20 points at Duke, becoming the first ACC freshman to score 20 points at Cameron Indoor Stadium since Hansbrough (27 pts) in 2006

• With 28 points vs. VMI, 21 points vs. USF and 22 points vs. Radford, Landesberg became the first Cavalier freshman to open his career with three 20-point games

• He was only the second freshman in ACC history to score at least 20 points in the first three games of his career (Georgia Tech's Kenny Anderson scored at least 20 points in his first six career games in 1989-90)

# Landesberg Makes Immediate Impact

• At 17.4 ppg, Sylven Landesberg is the eighth-leading scorer in the ACC and the second-leading freshman scorer in the nation

• At Georgia Tech, Landesberg scored 26 points, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his ACC debut (previous record was 22 by Roger Mason, Jr. vs. Duke in 1999-00)

• Landesberg scored in double figures in the first eight games of the season, the second longest streak by a UVa freshman to open a career

• He was the first Cavalier freshman since Tom Sheehey in 1983-84 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first three games of the season

# **Getting to the Line**

Sylven Landesberg ranks fifth in the ACC with 6.5 free throw attempts per game

• Landesberg has made 16 "old-fashioned" three-point plays this season (the rest of the team has combined for 13)

• That figure is already more than Sean Singletary's team-leading 13 "and one" plays last season

• Against Florida State on Jan. 24, Landesberg tied an ACC freshman record and tied for the second best performance at the free throw line in school history with his 14-14 performance

# Landesberg Shines In Collegiate Debut

• Sylven Landesberg had 28 points in the seasonopener against VMI, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his debut

•The previous record was 24 points set by Jeff Lamp in his debut against James Madison on Nov. 25, 1977

 Landesberg's 28 points are tied for the second most in ACC history by a freshman in his first game

Landesberg is one of only four Cavalier first-years to score 20 points in his first collegiate game
He is the first Cavalier freshman to lead the team in scoring in a season opener since Mamadi Diane had 17 points in the 2005-06 season opening win over Liberty

### Back-to-Back 25 Points for Landesberg

- Sylven Landesberg scored 26 points at Georgia Tech and 25 points vs. Xavier
- Landesberg was the first Cavalier to have consecutive 25-point games since J.R. Reynolds accomplished the feat in both of Virginia's 2007 NCAA Tournament games
- The last Cavalier freshman to score at least 25 points in consecutive games was Chris Williams in 1998-99 (26 vs. Loyola, 26 vs. Delaware)

#### **Tucker Steps Up**

- Jamil Tucker has scored in double figures in 11 games this season
- At Maryland, he scored a career-high 21 points while tying a career high with four 3-pointers
- Against Longwood, he set career highs with 10 rebounds and three assists and had 11 points for his first career double-double
- At Georgia Tech, he had 15 points, including the 3-pointer that tied the game with 15 seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime

### **Scott is a Force Inside**

- Mike Scott has seven double-doubles this season
- He is third in the ACC with 3.3 offensive rebounds per game and ranks 10th overall in rebounding with an average of 7.1 per game
- Scott is shooting .548 from the floor this season, which would rank second in the ACC if he had the minimum number of made field goals to qualify (he averages 4.1 FGM/game, 5.0 is the min.)
- At Maryland, Scott went 10-10 from the free throw line

### Mike Scott Opens Season With Impressive Performance

Mike Scott set career highs with 26 points and 18 rebounds in the season opening win over VMI
Scott tied the school record with 10 offensive rebounds, a mark previously set by Matt Blundin (vs. Clemson 1/9/90), Bryant Stith (vs. Georgia Tech 3/13/92) and Travis Watson (vs. Maryland 1/31/02)
His 18 rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds vs. Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003

# Scott and Landesberg Post UVa's First 25-25 Combo in Over a Year

• Against VMI, Sylven Landesberg (28 pts) and Mike Scott (26 points) became the first Cavaliers to score at least 25 points in the same game in over a year

• The previous game that Virginia had a pair of 25-point scorers was a 71-58 win at NC State on Jan. 24, 2007 when J.R Reynolds had 29 points and Sean Singletary had 27 points

# Cavaliers 12th in ACC Preseason Poll

The Cavaliers were projected 12th in the preseason ACC poll of media
Sylven Landesberg was second in the voting for Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year

### Head Coach Dave Leitao

- 2007 ACC Coach of the Year
- First Virginia coach to win the honor since Terry Holland in 1982
- 62-58 record in his fourth season at Virginia, including a 26-36 mark in the ACC
- Overall record of 142-127 in his ninth season as a head coach

### **Baker, Diane, Soroye Named Virginia's Captains**

- Calvin Baker, Mamadi Diane, and Tunji Soroye are Virginia's captains for 2008-09
- This season marks the first year each player has served as a captain

### Virginia Signs Two to Letters of Intent

• The Cavaliers signed two recruits to National Letters of Intent during the November signing period • Jontel Evans, a 5-11 guard from Hampton, Va., and Tristan Spurlock, a 6-7 forward from Woodbridge, Va., will join the Cavaliers in 2009-10

Sylven Landesberg scored 28 points, grabbed eight rebounds and had eight assists, and Mike Scott added career highs of 26 points and 18 rebounds to lead Virginia to a season-opening 107-97 victory over VMI at John Paul Jones Arena. Mamadi Diane and Jamil Tucker each added 14 points, and Sammy Zeglinski scored 11 points for the Cavaliers. The victory was the 11th consecutive season-

opening victory for Virginia.

Landesberg's 28 points are the most by a Virginia freshman in his collegiate debut and tied for the second most by an ACC freshman in his first game.

Scott tied a school record with 10 offensive rebounds and his 18 total rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds against Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003.

A 28-9 run gave Virginia a 36-19 lead with 10:14 left to play in the first half, but the Keydets rallied to cut the UVa lead to 51-45 at halftime. Scott had 14 first half points for the Cavaliers, Landesberg had 13 and Tucker 10.

The game was tied 82-82 with 6:47 to play when Virginia went on a 10-2 run to take control of the game. A jumper by Scott gave Virginia the lead for good at 84-82 with 6:30 remaining and two three-pointers by Jeff Jones completed the run. VMI didn't get closer than four points the rest of the game.

The Cavaliers shot 54.4 percent (43-79) from the field, out-rebounded the Keydets 50-35 and had 24 assists. VMI shot 46.8 percent (37-79) from the field, 93.3 percent (14-15) from the free throw line and had 15 steals. Virginia shot 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line.

Twin brothers Chavis and Travis Holmes led VMI. Chavis Holmes scored a game-high 31 points and Travis Holmes had 20 points. Austin Kenon added 18 points, while Willie Bell and Keith Gabriel each scored 14 points.

Sylven Landesberg scored on a layup with 13 seconds left in the game to give Virginia the lead for good at 76-75 and then added a free throw six seconds later to account for the final margin of victory as the Cavaliers defeated the University of South Florida 77-75 at John Paul Jones Arena.

Landesberg finished with a team-high 21 points and also had four rebounds and three steals. He is the first Virginia freshman since Gary Forbes in 2003-04 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first two games of the season.

Jamil Tucker added a career-high 15 points for the Cavaliers and led the team with seven rebounds. Mamadi Diane added 13 points, while Mike Scott scored 10 points and had six rebounds.

USF jumped out to a 10-2 lead 5:01 into the game, but UVa battled back and to tie the game 34-34 at halftime. Dominique Jones scored 13 points in the first half for USF and Diane had 10 first half points for the Cavaliers.

Virginia trailed by as many as six points in the second half (61-55 with 9:06 to play) before rallying for the victory. Landesberg and Tucker each scored 12 points in the second half to lead UVa.

The Cavaliers shot 40.3 percent (27-67) from the field, including 26.3 percent (5-19) from threepoint range, and 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line. Virginia had eight steals and turned the ball over only 10 times in the game. USF shot 49.2 percent (32-65) from the field, including 33.3 percent (5-15) from three-point range, and 50 percent (6-12) from the free throw line. The Bulls turned the ball over 14 times.

Jones finished with a game-high 23 points to lead USF and Jesus Verdejo scored 22 points. Chris Howard scored 12 points for the Bulls and Alex Rivas Sanchez added 10 points and nine rebounds.

"Without playing particularly well today, we still were able to win. And were able do it a little bit 'gutty'. In the last five minutes, we were finally getting some stops that we weren't successful in stringing together in the previous 35 (minutes). Syracuse scored 10 consecutive points, the first six on two three-pointers by Andy Rautins, to take a six-point lead at 62-56 with 6:12 remaining in the game and the Orange went on to a 73-70 victory over Virginia at the Carrier Dome. Rautins' second three-pointer in the run gave Syracuse its first lead (58-56 with 7:54 left to play) since a 2-0 lead in the first minute of the game.

Virginia led by as many as 13 points (40-27) with 30 seconds left in the first half after a 9-0 run that featured five points by Calvin Baker and the Cavaliers led by 11 (40-29) at halftime. UVa's biggest lead of the second half was 12 points on two occasions, the last with 16:57 to play in the game (45-33) after a jump shot by Baker.

Sylven Landesberg led five Virginia players in double figures in scoring with 16 points. Baker and Sammy Zeglinski each scored 14 points, while Mike Scott added 10 points, 10 rebounds and a career-high four assists, and Jerome Meyinsse 10 points and eight rebounds. The double-double was the second of the season for Scott and the fourth of his UVa career.

Four Syracuse players scored in double figures as the Orange remained undefeated at 6-0. Jonny Flynn scored 15 points and had six assists, and Rautins also scored 15 points to lead Syracuse. Eric Devendorf added 14 points and four assists, and Paul Harris scored 13 points and had eight rebounds for the Orange. Arinze Onuaku led Syracuse with 10 rebounds.

Virginia shot 42.2 percent (27-64) from the field for the game, including 28.6 percent (4-14) from three-point range, and 70.6 percent (12-17) from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded the Orange 38-33.

Syracuse shot 46.7 percent (21-45) from the field, including 30.8 percent (4-13) from three-point range, and 71.1 percent (27-38) from the free throw line. The Orange blocked nine Virginia shots.

Virginia lost its third consecutive game when the Cavaliers dropped a 66-56 decision at Minnesota in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge. UVa shot just 31.4 percent (16-51) from the field and turned the ball over 19 times in the loss to the Golden Gophers.

Minnesota made two runs that helped the Golden Gophers take control of the game. The first came with Virginia leading by five points at 16-11.

Starting with a three-pointer by Blake Hoffarber with 8:13 remaining in the first half, Minnesota outscored the Cavaliers 15-2 over a span of 2:43 to take a 26-18 lead with 5:30 left in the half.

The Cavaliers cut the lead to three points (32-29) at halftime and narrowed the deficit to one (32-31) on two free throws by Calvin Baker with 18:48 to play in the game. Minnesota then went on a 13-2 run over a span of 4:14 to take a 12-point lead at 45-33 with 13:42 left to play.

UVa pulled within four points at 48-44 with 10:17 remaining in the game after an 11-3 run of its own and had two possessions to draw closer, but the Cavaliers were unable to score on either possession.

Jamil Tucker scored a team-high 12 points on a career-high four three-point field goals to lead Virginia in scoring. Sylven Landesberg scored 10 points and had six rebounds for the Cavaliers, and Sammy Zeglinski added 10 points.

UVa shot 30 percent (6-20) from three-point range and 81.8 percent (18-22) from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded Minnesota 40-32.

Colton Iverson led the Golden Gophers with game-high totals of 14 points and seven rebounds. Lawrence Westbrook scored 13 points for Minnesota and Hoffarber added 12 points.

Minnesota shot 41.5 percent (22-53) from the field, including 25 percent (6-24) from three-point range, and 76.2 percent (16-21) from the free throw line. The Golden Gophers had 10 steals in the game, blocked seven shots and turned the ball over 12 times

Jamil Tucker's three-point field goal with 14.7 seconds left in regulation forced overtime and Calvin Baker's driving layup with 10.3 seconds remaining in the overtime period put Virginia ahead for good as the Cavaliers won their Atlantic Coast Conference opener 88-84 at Georgia Tech.

Virginia led by as many as 11 points in the first half after jumping to a 17-6 lead 4:09 into the game. The Cavaliers were ahead by seven (44-37) at halftime behind 14 first-half points by Sylven Landesberg and 10 by Mustapha Farrakhan.

Georgia Tech opened the second half with a 9-0 run to take the lead and the Yellow Jackets led by as many as five points (69-64) with 3:45 left in regulation before the Cavaliers rallied to send the game to overtime.

Landesberg finished with a game-high total of 26 points, and he also had six rebounds and five assists. Tucker tied his career high with 15 points and had six rebounds, Baker had 13 points and Farrakhan scored a career-high 12 points. Mike Scott had his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Virginia shot 44.3 percent (31-70) from the field, including 39.1 percent (9-23) from three-point range, and 77.3 percent (17-22) from the free throw line.

Gani Lawal led Georgia Tech with 21 points and nine rebounds, while Lewis Clinch and Iman Shumpert each scored 18 points. Alade Aminu had a double-double for the Yellow Jackets with 13 points and 12 rebounds.

Georgia Tech shot 43.1 percent (31-72) from the field, including 33.3 percent (6-18) from three-point range, but the Yellow Jackets made only 48.5 percent (16-33) of their free throw attempts. Georgia Tech out-rebounded Virginia 50-42 and the Yellow Jackets had 20 offensive rebounds.

It was the first overtime victory for the Cavaliers on an opponent's home court since an 84-82 double overtime win at NC State on Feb. 8, 1996.

Xavier out-scored Virginia 23-2 during a 5:55 stretch early in the first half, including a 19-0 run, and went on to an 84-70 victory over the Cavaliers at John Paul Jones Arena.

The Musketeers led by as many as 21 points in the first half and led by 16 (42-26) at halftime. Xavier went on a 13-0 run early in the second half to expand its lead to 28 points (60-32) with 13:00 left to play and the closest Virginia could get after that was 12 points (82-70) with just 38 seconds left in the game.

Sylven Landesberg scored a game-high 25 points, grabbed seven rebounds and had four assists for the Cavaliers. It was his second consecutive game with at least 25 points after scoring 26 in an 88-84 overtime victory over Georgia Tech on Dec. 28. Xavier shot 44.6 percent (29-65) from the field for the game, including 40.9 percent (9-22) from threepoint range, and 68.0 percent (17-25) from the free throw line. The Musketeers out-rebounded Virginia 44-35 and Xavier got 37 points from its bench.

Tyler Hansbrough had game-high totals of 28 points and 12 rebounds to lead No. 5 North Carolina to an 83-61 victory over Virginia at John Paul Jones Arena.

The Tar Heels opened the game with a 14-2 run over the first 5:07 led by Danny Green's seven points, but the Cavaliers countered with a 12-1 run of their own, featuring six points by Mustapha Farrakhan, to cut the North Carolina lead to 15-14 with 10:40 left in the first half. North Carolina responded with an 11-2 run to open up a 26-16 advantage with 8:33 left in the half and the Tar Heels went on to lead by 14 points (50-36) at halftime

A 10-0 North Carolina run expanded the lead to 24 points (62-38) early in the second half and the Tar Heels led by as many as 27 points in securing the vic-tory. It was the fifth consecutive win in the series for North Carolina and marked the second consecutive season the Tar Heels won at John Paul Jones Arena.

Virginia shot 30.5 percent (25-82) from the field, includ-ing just 14.8 percent (4-27) from three-point range, and the Cavaliers made 77.8 percent (7-9) of their free throws. Hansbrough's 28 points led four players in double figure scoring for North Carolina. Ty Lawson scored 19

points and had a game-high nine assists, while Green and Wayne Ellington each scored 13 points.

North Carolina shot 42.2 percent (27-64) from the field, including 35.7 percent (5-14) from three-point range, and 85.7 percent (24-28) from the free throw line.

"When you give an excellent team a reason to batten down the hatches, clean up some things and gain some time to practice on it, it was going to take a monumental effort to withstand that. At the start of the game, we had to come out and be ready. The first four minutes were critically important. We battled, but we got down 10-2. We couldn't make a shot, and as a result, we were a little tentative. We had a chance to fight back. It has been a dis-turbing pattern in that we leak a little oil toward the end of the first half and got down double-digits" - Dave Leitao

Maryland built a 15-point halftime lead and then held off a second half Virginia rally to defeat the Cavaliers 84-78 in College Park, Md.

The Terrapins used a 17-5 run over the last 6:46 of the first half to lead by as many as 17 points (45-28) with 1:16 remaining in the half and by a score of 45-30 at halftime. The Cavaliers chipped away at the Maryland lead in the second half and got within two points (65-63) with 5:05 left to play. The Terrapins then went on a 9-2 run to build their lead back to nine points (74-65) with 2:20 remaining and Virginia could get no closer than four points the rest of the way.

Jamil Tucker scored a career-high 21 points on 7-12 shooting from the field, including 4-6 from three-point range, and he made all three of his free throw attempts to lead the Cavaliers. Mike Scott had his sixth double-double of the season for Virginia with 16 points and 10 rebounds, and Calvin Baker added 16 points. Scott made all 10 of his free throw attempts. Sylven Landesberg had a careerhigh 11 rebounds for the Cavaliers.

Virginia shot 45.8 percent (27-59) from the field, including 30.0 percent (6-20) from three-point range, and a season-high 85.7 percent (18-21) from the free throw line.

Adrian Bowie and Landon Milbourne led four Maryland players in double figures in scoring with 17 points each. Greivis Vasquez added 16 points and Eric Hayes had 10 points and 11 assists for the Terrapins.

Maryland shot 53.7 percent (29-54) from the field, including 50.0 percent (5-10) from three-point range, and 87.5 percent (21-24) from the free throw line

"It's not going to be a situation that's productive to winning when you dig a hole as we did in the beginning of the game and throughout the first half. The tentativeness on offense got us turnovers; not playing basketball north and south got us turnovers. Bad shot selection led to fast-break points on their end, and when we don't get good possessions we tend to not play as well on the defensive end. We gave them 45 points in the first half and we obviously just couldn't climb out of that hole." - **Dave Leitao**

Florida State held Virginia to three field goals, 16 points and 13.6 percent (3-22) shooting from the field in the first half in building a 14-point halftime lead (30-16) and the Seminoles went on to a 73-62 victory over the Cavaliers at John Paul Jones Arena.

Florida State took control of the game with a 14-0 run over a 6:24 stretch of the first half to build a 24-5 lead with 6:40 remaining in the half. The Seminoles led by as many as 21 points in the second half. The Cavaliers' 16 first half points were the fewest

they'd scored before halftime since scoring 15 against Connecticut on Nov. 29, 1993, at University Hall. Virginia's three first half field goals were the fewest in a half for the Cavaliers since they made three field goals in the second half at NC State on Feb. 19, 1997.

The closest UVa got to the Seminoles in the second half was the final margin of 11 points.

Sylven Landesberg scored a game-high 24 points and had six rebounds to lead the Cavaliers. It was his ninth 20-point game of the season, tying Virginia's freshman record. Landesberg made all 14 of his free throw attempts in the game, tying for the second best perfect game from the line in UVa history.

Jamil Tucker was the only other UVa player to score in double figures with 10 points. It was Tucker's third consecutive double figure scoring effort, the longest streak of his career.

Virginia shot 35.4 percent (17-48) from the field for the game, including 28.6 percent (4-14) from three-point range, and the Cavaliers made 80.0 percent (24-30) of their free throw attempts.

Toney Douglas led Florida State with 21 points and Solomon Álabi added 10.

Florida State shot 50.0 percent (27-54) from the field, including 53.3 percent (8-15) from three-point range, and 84.6 percent (11-13) from the free throw line.

"The way Florida State plays basketball—systematically and methodically—wore us out and wore us down men-tally, starting with the beginning of the game. We have been preaching for the last couple of days about offense. You have to take advantage of every opportunity to score because there just aren't that many" - **Dave Leitao**

Gerald Henderson scored 16 points in the first half as Duke built a 43-21 halftime lead and the top-ranked Blue Devils went on to a 79-54 victory over Virginia at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Duke took control of the game with a 20-3 run over a 4:36 span of the first half to build a 34-12 lead with 8:20 left in the half. Nolan Smith added 11 points for Duke in the first half and the Cavaliers committed 17 first-half turnovers.

The Blue Devils led by as many as 27 points in the second half as Virginia lost for the 13th consecutive time at Duke.

Sylven Landesberg scored a game-high 20 points to lead the Cavaliers. He was 8-10 from the field in the game. It was the 10th time during the season that Landesberg scored at least 20 points in a game, establishing a UVa freshman record.

Mike Scott was the only other Virginia player to score in double figures with 10 points. It was the eighth time in the last nine games Scott scored in double figures.

Virginia shot 42.9 percent (21-49) from the field, including 25.0 percent (3-12) from three-point range, and 69.2 percent (9-13) from the free throw line in the game.

Henderson finished with 18 points and four assists to lead Duke. Smith scored 15 points and Jon Scheyer had 11 points and a game-high seven rebounds for the Blue Devils.

Duke shot 46.3 percent (31-67) from the field, including 33.3 percent (9-27) from three-point range, and 57.1 percent (8-14) from the free throw line. The loss was the fifth in a row for the Cavaliers.

"Simply stated, we played a team that is obviously very good, very talented, and very experienced and on a bit of a mission. Whether it's what they are trying to do with the season or coming off of their last game, they focused on some very specific things to make their train run smoothly. Missed assignments on both offense and defense early really set a bad tone that caused us to furn over the ball a number of times and caused us to have a number of unforced turnovers that obviously equated to us having 17 at halftime. I said during the first TV timeout that the things we talked about and we were executing and preparing for in practice every day really didn't show at all at any point in time in the game." - Dave Leitao

Boston College shot 68.2 percent (15-22) from the field in the first half, including 60 percent (3-5) from three-point range, in taking a 42-22 halftime lead and the Eagles went on to an 80-70 victory over Virginia at John Paul Jones Arena. Boston College also shot 90 percent (9-10) from the free throw line in the first half.

A 10-0 run over a period of 4:42 gave the Eagles a 20-9 lead with 9:54 left in the first half as they started to take control of the game. A run of 13-2 later in the half gave Boston College a 35-14 lead with 3:35 remaining to play before halftime. The Eagles led by as many as 22 points in the first half and also led by 22 early in the second half.

Five players - Calvin Baker, Jeff Jones, Sylven Landesberg, Assane Sene and Solomon Tat – played most of the second half for Virginia. The Cavaliers got within seven points with 1:57 left in the game, but could get no closer.

Landesberg scored a season and game-high 32 points and had six rebounds to lead Virginia. Landesberg was 13-23 from the field and made all six of his free throw attempts in the game. It was the most points scored by a UVa freshman since Chris Williams scored 34 points against Liberty on Dec. 8, 1998.

Jones was the only other player to score in double figures for the Cavaliers with 10 points, while Sene had a season and game-high 13 rebounds.

Virginia shot 33.3 percent (23-69) from the field, including just 7.1 percent (1-14) from three-point range, and 79.3 percent (23-29) from the free throw line.

Tyrese Rice scored 20 points and had a gamehigh six assists, and Rakim Sanders had a doubledouble with 20 points and 10 rebounds to lead Boston College. Biko Paris and Joe Trapani each added 12 points for the Eagles.

Boston College shot 51.1 percent (24-47) from the field, including 35.3 percent (6-17) from threepoint range, and 83.9 percent (26-31) from the free throw line for the game.

North Carolina outscored Virginia 16-2 over a span of 7:22 at the end of the first half and the beginning of the second half to take control of the game. Florida State shot 70.8 percent (17-24) from the field in the second half and broke a 43-43 tie by running off nine consecutive points late in the game as the No. 25 Seminoles defeated Virginia 68-57 in Tallahassee, Fla. The decisive 9-0 run gave Florida State a 52-43 lead with 4:26 left to play. UVa got no closer than six points the rest of the game.

It was the eighth consecutive loss for the Cavaliers. Virginia led 22-20 at halftime as neither team shot well from the field in the first 20 minutes. The Cavaliers made 27.8 percent (10-36) of their first half shots and the Seminoles made 26.1 percent (6-23) of their shots.

Sylven Landesberg tied the game at 74-74 with a layup with 13.4 seconds remaining in regulation and then scored six of Virginia's 11 points in overtime to lead the Cavaliers to an 85-81 victory over No. 12 Clemson at John Paul Jones Arena.

Landesberg scored a game-high 23 points and four other Virginia players scored in double figures as the Cavaliers broke an eight-game losing streak.

UVa led 33-25 at halftime, but Clemson opened the second half with a 14-0 run to take a 39-33 lead with 16:26 left in the game. K.C. Rivers and Terrence Oglesby each scored six points in the run for the Tigers.

Virginia came right back with a 7-1 run to tie the game at 40-40 with 14:38 to play in regulation. The game remained close with neither team leading by more than five points the rest of the way and Landesberg's late field goal sent the game to overtime.

Clemson took an early three-point lead in the overtime period before a 6-0 Virginia run gave the Cavaliers the lead for good at 80-77 with 2:53 left to play.

In addition to Landesberg's 23 points, the Cavaliers got 18 points and 10 rebounds from Mike Scott, 15 points from Sammy Zeglinski, 12 points from Jeff Jones and 11 points from Jamil Tucker. The doubledouble was Scott's seventh of the season.

Virginia shot 53.1 percent (34-64) from the field, including 46.7 percent (7-15) from three-point range, and 62.5 percent (10-16) from the free throw line for the game.

Öglesby scored 17 points to lead four Clemson players in double figures in scoring. Trevor Booker scored 16 points and had seven rebounds, Rivers scored 15 points and Demontez Stitt added 12 points. The Tigers' Raymond Sykes had a game-high 11 rebounds.

Clemson shot 43.1 percent (28-65) from the field, including 34.6 percent (9-26) from three-point range, and 76.2 percent (16-21) from the free throw line.

UVa broke a 29-29 tie by scoring the last 10 points of the first half to take a 39-29 halftime lead. Tunji Soroye scored five of Virginia's points in that run. The Cavaliers then outscored Virginia Tech 7-2 in the first 2:23 of the second half to increase their lead to 46-31 with 17:37 left in the game. Jeff Jones scored five of Virginia's first seven points of the second half.

Virginia led by as many as 19 points (60-41) with 7:21 remaining to play and after that the Hokies could get no closer than eight points at 67-59 with

2:37 left in the game. Sylven Landesberg scored 19 points, had nine rebounds and six assists to lead Virginia. Three other UVa players scored in double figures as Jamil Tucker had 13 points and nine rebounds, and Calvin Baker and Mike Scott each scored 10 points. Sammy Zeglinski had six assists for the Cavaliers.

UVa shot 43.9 percent (25-57) from the field, including 38.9 percent (7-18) from three-point range, and 75.0 percent (18-24) from the free throw line.

A.D. Vassallo scored 21 points and had eight rebounds to lead Virginia Tech. Malcolm Delaney added 11 points and five assists for the Hokies, J.T. Thompson scored 10 points, and Cheick Diakite had nine points and nine rebounds.

Virginia Tech shot 36.7 percent (22-60) from the field, including 21.1 percent (4-19) from three-point range, and 76.5 percent (13-17) from the free throw line.

The Cavaliers ran off nine consecutive points to close within one (68-67) with 8.7 seconds left, but State's Courtney Fells made four free throws in the final 7.2 seconds to provide the Wolfpack with the final margin of victorv

NC State scored the game's first eight points and led by 18 (24-6) with 8:30 remaining in the first half before Virginia rallied to get within two points with nine seconds left before halftime. The Wolfpack led 33-29 at halftime and outscored UVa 19-6 in the first 9:22 of the second half to build the lead back to 17 points.

For the second consecutive game, Sylven Landesberg led the Cavaliers in points, rebounds and assists. Landesberg finished the game with 16 points, eight rebounds and six assists. Calvin Baker had 13 points, five assists and three steals for Virginia, and Mamadi Diane added 11 points on 5-6 shooting from the field for the Cavaliers.

UVa shot 43.9 percent (25-57) from the field, including 41.7 percent (5-12) from three-point range, and 66.7 percent (12-18) from the free throw line for the game. Virginia also had 11 steals and forced 20 turnovers by State.

Four players scored in double figures for NC State led by 16 points from C.J. Williams. Tracy Smith scored 13 points and had seven rebounds, Dennis Horner scored 12 points, and Ben McCauley had a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

NC State shot 53.2 percent (25-47) from the field, including 44.4 percent (8-18) from three-point range, and 63.6 percent (14-22) from the free throw line.

"I'm disappointed. We had opportunities and we didn't execute. We tried to dig out of holes, but we were playing uphill most of the game. 



"He's a really good player – he's an attacking player, who puts you in a position where you can foul him. And we did for those three-point plays. He's taller than I thought. For a wing player who can put the ball on the floor, that means he can shoot over people. It's not like a 6-3 guy who can drive. He has good length and has an instinctive ability to get closer. He's a good player, and puts defenses in help-and-recover situations if you're not careful."

"He's going to be a complete player, there's no question about that. Right now his game is more driving to the goal, but we were trying to make sure we cut off his driving lanes. ... He's going to be a complete player. He's had a heck of a year." - North Carolina Head Coach Roy Williams

"The guy's going to get 20 whether it's quiet or loud. You can tell your guys to stay in front of him, but he got 20 without having to take a pull-up jumper. We told our guys, you have to stay in front of him and get lower than him, and he still drives to the basket. He's a good player; you're just not going to stop him." - Virginia Tech Head Coach Seth Greenberg

"He's an outstanding player. He's good going to the basket. He finishes very well, and he just kept attacking the basket. He did a good job of getting to the free throw line, and he is an excellent free throw shooter. So, if they're going to spread the floor like that he can be pretty effective" - Boston College Head Coach AI Skinner

"He can shoot and I think he will get better. He is a big, strong guard and it's amazing how he can get fouled. We were very worried about him being able to get to the basket. Part of our game plan was to try to make it tough for him to go one-onone, make him a passer. If he took shots in the lane, crowd the lane. He has a great talent of being able to get fouled. He certainly is one of the best players we have played against, regardless of if he is a freshman or not." - Xavier Head Coach Sean Miller

"You have to try to keep him out of there (the lane) the best you can. It is easy to say and hard to do. I think you have to be able to defend him multiple ways. He is very good off the bounce in going one way, changing and making two or three moves. You just can't rely on defending him with one guy. You have to have a team defense to try to keep him out of the paint area" - Auburn Head Coach Jeff Lebo

"He is a very good athlete. He's got great ball skills. He has like a point guard hand on the ball and he knows what he wants to do. He is a great driver and a great and-one guy. He's got a good touch. He doesn't have to get all the way to the rim to score – he can shoot that little floater. He also has size and athleticism." - Clemson Head Coach Oliver Purnell
