Tonight's Game

- The Cavaliers conclude their four-game season-opening homestand tonight vs. Liberty
- Virginia looks to open the season 4-0 for the third consecutive year and the fifth time in the past six years

About the Cavaliers

- Virginia opened the season with home wins over VMI, USF and Radford
- Five Cavaliers are averaging double figures in scoring
- UVa is led by Sylven Landesberg, who leads the ACC in scoring at 23.7 points per game

About the Flames

- Liberty is 1-1 after a win over Montreat (NAIA) and a loss at UNC Asheville
- The Flames were fourth in the preseason Big South poll
- Liberty is led in scoring by freshman guard Seth Curry (20.5 ppg), younger brother of Davidson All-American Stephen Curry
- Senior guard Anthony Smith (19.0 ppg) was the preseason Big South Player of the Year

Series History

- Virginia leads the series 6-1 (all of the games have been played in Charlottesville)
- The Cavaliers have won the last three meetings

Close Wins

- Virginia has won its first three games of the season by a combined 14 points
- It marks the first time in school history that the Cavaliers have opened a season with three victories of 10 points or less
- Virginia is already halfway to its total of wins by 10 or less for all of last season (six)

November Success

- Virginia has posted a 16-3 record in November under Dave Leitao
- The Cavaliers have won 36 consecutive November home games dating back to a 94-83 loss to Ohio on November 18, 1994
- Virginia has a 4-2 record against ranked opponents in November since 2000

Series Against the Big South

- Tonight's game is Virginia's third game of three this season vs. Big South opponents (VMI, Radford)
- Virginia has a 120-16 all-time record against current members of the Big South (1-0 vs. Charleston Southern, 2-0 vs. Coastal Carolina, 1-0 vs. Gardner Webb, 1-0 vs. High Point, 6-1 vs. Liberty, 5-0 vs. Radford, 1-0 vs. UNC-Asheville, 101-15 vs. VMI, 2-0 vs. Winthrop)
- UVa has won its last 16 games against Big South opponents, dating back to 1998

Against the State

- Tonight's game is the third of seven this season against in-state opponents
- Under Dave Leitao, Virginia has a 15-3 record against in-state opponents
- Virginia has won 15 consecutive games against non-conference in-state opponents dating back to the 2002-03 season (73-55 loss at Virginia Tech, when the Hokies were in the Big East)

Last Time Out

- Virginia improved to 3-0 on the season with a 68-66 victory over Radford
- Sylven Landesberg led the Cavaliers with 22 points, 18 of which came in the second half, including two free throws to put Virginia up for good with 29 seconds left

Balanced Attack

- Virginia enters the game with five players averaging double figures in scoring: Sylven Landesberg (23.7), Mike Scott (13.7), Jamil Tucker (11.0), Sammy Zeglinski (10.3), Mamadi Diane (10.0)
- The last time the Cavaliers had five players averaging double figures after three games was the 2003-04 season

Landesberg Named ACC Rookie of the Week ... Again

- Sylven Landesberg was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on Nov. 24, the second consecutive week he won the honor
- He is the first Cavalier to win the award in consecutive weeks since Sean Singletary won it on Feb. 14, 2005 and Feb. 21, 2005
- He is the first player to win the award in each of the first two weeks of the season since Georgia Tech's Chris Bosh in 2002-03

Landesberg Leads in Scoring

- Sylven Landesberg leads the ACC with a 23.7 scoring average
- He is tied for 22nd in scoring nationally and is the only true freshman to be ranked in the top 50 nationally in scoring

Landesberg Makes Immediate Impact

- With 28 points vs. VMI, 21 points vs. USF and 22 points vs. Radford, Sylven Landesberg became the first Cavalier freshman to open his career with three 20-point games
- He is the first Cavalier freshman since Tom Sheehey in 1983-84 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first three games of the season
- He is only the second freshman in ACC history to score at least 20 points in the first three games of his career (Georgia Tech's Kenny Anderson scored at least 20 points in his first six career games
- He is the first Cavalier player to score 20 or more points in the first three games of a season since Roger Mason, Jr. in 2001-02



Landesberg Shines In Collegiate Debut

- Sylven Landesberg had 28 points in the seasonopener against VMI, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his debut
- •The previous record was 24 points set by Jeff Lamp in his debut against James Madison on Nov. 25, 1977
- Landesberg's 28 points are tied for the second most in ACC history by a freshman in his first game
- Landesberg is one of only four Cavalier first-years to score 20 points in his first collegiate game
- His 28 points are the most by a UVa freshman in any game since Chris Williams had 34 points vs. Liberty on Dec. 8, 1998
- He is the first Cavalier freshman to lead the team in scoring in a season opener since Mamadi Diane had 17 points in the 2005-06 season opening win over Liberty

Mike Scott Opens Season With Impressive Performance

- Mike Scott set career highs with 26 points and 18 rebounds in the season opening win over VMI
- Scott tied the school record with 10 offensive rebounds, a mark previously set by Matt Blundin (vs. Clemson 1/9/90), Bryant Stith (vs. Georgia Tech 3/13/92) and Travis Watson (vs. Maryland 1/31/02)
- His 18 rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds vs. Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003

Scott and Landesberg Post UVa's First 25-25 Combo in Over a Year

- Against VMI, Sylven Landesberg (28 pts) and Mike Scott (26 points) became the first Cavaliers to score at least 25 points in the same game in over a year
- The previous game that Virginia had a pair of 25-point scorers was a 71-58 win at NC State on Jan. 24, 2007 when J.R Reynolds had 29 points and Sean Singletary had 27 points

Tucker Steps Up

- Jamil Tucker posted a pair of career highs to open the season
- Against VMI, Tucker tied his previous career high with 14 points
- He topped that mark with a new career-high 15 points against USF

Cavaliers 12th in ACC Preseason Poll

- The Cavaliers were projected 12th in the preseason ACC poll of media
- Sylven Landesberg was second in the voting for Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year

Difficult Schedule for the Cavaliers

- 16 of 27 regular season games will be against 2008 postseason teams (seven vs. NCAA teams, eight vs. NIT teams, one vs. CBI team)
- 21 of 27 games will be televised
- Five opponents are ranked and four others are receiving votes in this week's Associated Press poll

Virginia Visited Canada in August

- The Cavaliers went on a trip to Canada in August to play three games
- Virginia went 2-1 on the trip
- UVa defeated St. Lawrence College (Ont.) 107-60
- UVa defeated Concordia 85-70
- UVa lost to McGill 88-83
- Four players averaged in double figures on the trip (Calvin Baker 16.0, Jeff Jones -13.7, Sylven Landesberg 12.0, Mike Scott 10.7)

- Calvin Baker, Mamadi Diane, and Tunji Soroye are Virginia's captains for 2008-09
- This season marks the first year each player has served as a captain

Sene to Be Held Out of Games

- Freshman center Assane Sene is being held out of games pending the resolution of his eligibility status
- He will continue to practice with the team
- "Because of a recent NCAA interpretation, there are some aspects of Assane's pre-college enrollment that must be reviewed further," Virginia Athletics Director Craig Littlepage said on Nov. 16. "We're looking to have this resolved quickly."
- Sene is from Saint-Louis, Senegal, and attended South Kent Preparatory School in Connecticut during the 2007-08 academic year

Sylven Landesberg scored 28 points, grabbed eight rebounds and had eight assists, and Mike Scott added career highs of 26 points and 18 rebounds to lead Virginia to a season-opening 107-97 victory over VMI at John Paul Jones Arena. Mamadi Diane and Jamil Tucker each added 14 points, and Sammy Zeglinski scored 11 points for the Cavaliers. The victory was the 11th consecutive season-

opening victory for Virginia.

Landesberg's 28 points are the most by a Virginia freshman in his collegiate debut and tied for the second most by an ACC freshman in his first

Scott tied a school record with 10 offensive rebounds and his 18 total rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds against Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003.

A 28-9 run gave Virginia a 36-19 lead with 10:14 left to play in the first half, but the Keydets rallied to cut the UVa lead to 51-45 at halftime. Scott had 14 first half points for the Cavaliers, Landesberg had 13 and Tucker 10.

The game was tied 82-82 with 6:47 to play when Virginia went on a 10-2 run to take control of the game. A jumper by Scott gave Virginia the lead for good at 84-82 with 6:30 remaining and two three-pointers by Jeff Jones completed the run. VMI didn't get closer than four points the rest of the game.

The Cavaliers shot 54.4 percent (43-79) from the field, out-rebounded the Keydets 50-35 and had 24 assists. VMI shot 46.8 percent (37-79) from the field, 93.3 percent (14-15) from the free throw line and had 15 steals. Virginia shot 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line.

Twin brothers Chavis and Travis Holmes led VMI. Chavis Holmes scored a game-high 31 points and Travis Holmes had 20 points. Austin Kenon added 18 points, while Willie Bell and Keith Gabriel each scored 14 points.

"With so many possessions, it is a difficult style to play against. It affected everything that we do: our lineups, holding the big guys out because it would be very difficult for them to guard on the perimeter. Sylven Landesberg scored on a layup with 13 seconds left in the game to give Virginia the lead for good at 76-75 and then added a free throw six seconds later to account for the final margin of victory as the Cavaliers defeated the University of South Florida 77-75 at John Paul Jones Arena.

Landesberg finished with a team-high 21 points and also had four rebounds and three steals. He is the first Virginia freshman since Gary Forbes in 2003-04 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first two games of the season.

Jamil Tucker added a career-high 15 points for the Cavaliers and led the team with seven rebounds. Mamadi Diane added 13 points, while Mike Scott scored 10 points and had six rebounds.

USF jumped out to a 10-2 lead 5:01 into the game, but UVa battled back and to tie the game 34-34 at halftime. Dominique Jones scored 13 points in the first half for USF and Diane had 10 first half points for the Cavaliers.

Virginia trailed by as many as six points in the second half (61-55 with 9:06 to play) before rallying for the victory. Landesberg and Tucker each scored 12 points in the second half to lead UVa.

The Cavaliers shot 40.3 percent (27-67) from the field, including 26.3 percent (5-19) from three-point range, and 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line. Virginia had eight steals and turned the ball over only 10 times in the game. USF shot 49.2 percent (32-65) from the field, including 33.3 percent (5-15) from three-point range, and 50 percent (6-12) from the free throw line. The Bulls turned the ball over 14 times.

Jones finished with a game-high 23 points to lead USF and Jesus Verdejo scored 22 points. Chris Howard scored 12 points for the Bulls and Alex Rivas Sanchez added 10 points and nine rebounds.

"Without playing particularly well today, we still were able to win. And were able do it a little bit 'gutty'. In the last five minutes, we were finally getting some stops that we weren't successful in stringing together in the previous 35 (minutes). Landesberg finished with a game-high total of 22 points and he also had four rebounds. He scored 18 of his points in the second half.

Sammy Zeglinski was the only other player to score in double figures for UVa with 11 points and he had five rebounds. Calvin Baker added nine points for the Cavaliers and Tunji Soroye added eight points, five rebounds and blocked two shots. Baker scored five of UVa's last seven points in the final 2:35 of the game.

Radford led 29-27 at halftime with Joey Lynch-Flohr's nine points leading the Highlander's. Zeglinski had nine first half points for the Cavaliers. Neither team led by more than four points in the second half before Virginia came from behind in the closing minute for the victory.

UVa shot 36.9 percent (24-65) from the field, including just 11.1 percent (1-9) from three-point range, and 79.2 percent (19-24 from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded the Highlanders 43-40. Radford shot 38.7 percent (24-62) from the field, including 4-12 from three-point range, and 56.0 percent (14-25) from the free throw line. The Highlanders blocked 10 of the Cavaliers' shots in the game.

Ärtsiom Parakhouski had a double-double for Radford with 16 points and 12 rebounds. Lynch-Flohr finished with 15 points, while Martell McDuffy scored 13 points and Kenny Thomas 10 for the Highlanders

"By chance today, we made a play or two at the end or they didn't execute a play or two at the end, and we were fortunate to win.
