- The Cavaliers travel to meet third-ranked North Carolina this afternoon
- Virginia is looking to snap a six-game losing streak
- The Tar Heels are the first team the Cavaliers have played twice this season

About the Cavaliers

- Virginia is 7-11 (1-6 ACC) after an 80-70 loss to Boston College on Wednesday
- UVa is led by Sylven Landesberg, who is averaging 18.1 ppg
- Mike Scott has posted six double-doubles this season
- As of 2/6 (ESPN Insider RPI), the Cavaliers' strength of schedule ranks sixth nationally

About the Tar Heels

- UNC is 20-2 this season (6-2 ACC) after a 108-91 home win over Maryland on Tuesday
- The Tar Heels enter the game on a six-game winning streak
- Senior forward Tyler Hansbrough leads the ACC with a 22.4 ppg scoring average

Series History

- UNC leads 123-48 (UNC leads 62-5 in Chapel Hill, 20-2 at the Smith Center)
- Virginia's last win in Chapel Hill came in 2001-02 (71-67)
- The Tar Heels defeated Virginia 83-61 on Jan. 15 at John Paul Jones Arena

Youth is Served

- Freshmen and Sophomores have made 62 of the 90 starts this season for the Cavaliers
- Freshmen and Sophomores have scored 50.4 ppg (69.1 % of offense) and average 23.8 rebounds a game (68.2 % of team total)
- Freshmen and Sophomores have led the team in scoring in 15 of 18 games this season and led the team in rebounding in 15 of 18 games this season

Close Games

- 11 of Virginia's 18 games this season have been decided by 10 points or less
- Seven of those games have been decided by five points or less
- The Cavaliers have four wins this season by 10 points or less, which is two shy of their total from last season (six)

Last Time Out

- Virginia suffered an 80-70 loss to Boston College on Wednesday
- Sylvan Landesberg led Virginia with 32 points, tying the school record for freshman scoring against an ACC opponent (Ralph Sampson set the record with 32 pts. vs. Clemson in 1980)
- His 32 points were the most by a freshman in an ACC game since Tyler Hansbrough scored 40 points vs. Miami in 2006

Bench Production

- Virginia has gotten solid production from its bench this season, averaging 24.9 points, 11.6 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game off the bench
- Virginia had 51 points off the bench against USF, the most bench points in a game for the Cavaliers since scoring 52 off the bench against Maryland on March 1, 1986
- This season the Cavaliers have gotten 19 double-digit scoring performances off the bench

Difficult Schedule for the Cavaliers

- Seven of Virginia's opponents are ranked and two others are receiving votes in this week's AP poll
- As of 2/6 (ESPN Insider RPI), the Cavaliers' strength of schedule ranks sixth nationally
- Virginia's first 18 opponents have a combined .645 winning percentage
- 18 of Virginia's first 19 opponents this season entered the game against the Cavaliers with a .500 or better record
- 16 of 27 regular season games will be against 2008 postseason teams (seven vs. NCAA teams, eight vs. NIT teams, one vs. CBI team)
- 21 of 27 games will be televised (the other six available online on ACC Select)

Return to Sene-der

- Freshman center Assane Sene leads Virginia with 27 blocks this season, although he did not play in the first four games of the season
- He has twice had four blocks in a game (vs. Auburn, at Virginia Tech)
- Last season, Mamadi Diane led Virginia with 22 blocks over a 33-game season
- Sene averages 1.9 blocks per game, which ranks third in the ACC

Farrakhan on the Line

- Mustapha Farrakhan is 18-18 this season from the free throw line
- His 18 consecutive made free throws to open a season is the second longest streak in school history (Jeff Lamp made his first 32 free throw attempts in 1980-81)

On a Streak From the Line

- Virginia has two players who have active consecutive free throws made streaks of at least 10
- Sylvan Landesberg has made 26 consecutive free throws (last miss at Maryland - 1/20/09)
- Landesberg's 26 consecutive made free throws are a UVa freshman record
- Mustapha Farrakhan has made 19 consecutive free throws (made his last one last season and all 18 this season)
- Calvin Baker and Mike Scott both had 10-plus free throw streaks earlier in the season

Landesberg Named ACC Rookie of the Week ... Again

- Sylvan Landesberg was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on Jan. 12, the fifth time he has received the honor
- Landesberg also was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Nov. 17, Nov. 24, Dec. 22 and Dec. 30
- He is the first Cavalier to win the award in consecutive weeks since Sean Singletary won it on Feb. 14, 2005 and Feb. 21, 2005
- He was the first player to win the award in each of the first two weeks of a season since Georgia Tech's Chris Bosh in 2002-03

Landesberg Explodes for 32 vs. Boston College

- Sylvan Landesberg scored a career-high 32 points vs. Boston College on Feb. 4
- His 32 points tied the UVa freshman scoring record against an ACC opponent that Ralph Sampson set when he scored 32 vs. Clemson in 1980
- His 32 points were the most by a freshman in an ACC game since Tyler Hansbrough scored 40 against Miami in 2006
- It was only the fourth 30-point game by a Virginia freshman in school history

Landesberg's 20-Point Games

- Sylvan Landesberg has 11 20-point games this season, setting a new UVa freshman record
- He has more than double the 20-point games (11) than the rest of the conference's freshmen combined (four)
- Only North Carolina's Tyler Hansbrough (14) and Rashad McCants (12) had more 20-point games as freshmen in the ACC over the past 10 years than Landesberg
- He scored 20 points at Duke, becoming the first ACC freshman to score 20 points at Cameron Indoor Stadium since Hansbrough (27 pts) in 2006
- With 28 points vs. VMI, 21 points vs. USF and 22 points vs. Radford, Landesberg became the first Cavalier freshman to open his career with three 20-point games
- He was only the second freshman in ACC history to score at least 20 points in the first three games of his career (Georgia Tech's Kenny Anderson scored at least 20 points in his first six career games in 1989-90)

Landesberg Makes Immediate Impact

- At 18.1 ppg, Sylvan Landesberg is the sixth-leading scorer in the ACC and the second-leading freshman scorer in the nation
- At Georgia Tech, Landesberg scored 26 points, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his ACC debut (previous record was 22 by Roger Mason, Jr. vs. Duke in 1999-00)
- Landesberg scored in double figures in the first eight games of the season, the second longest streak by a UVa freshman to open a career
- He was the first Cavalier freshman since Tom Sheehy in 1983-84 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first three games of the season

Getting to the Line

- Sylvan Landesberg ranks second in the ACC with 7.2 free throw attempts per game
- Landesberg has made 16 "old-fashioned" three-point plays this season (the rest of the team has combined for nine)
- That figure is already more than Sean Singletary's team-leading 13 "and one" plays last season
- Against Florida State, Landesberg tied an ACC freshman record and tied for the second best performance at the free throw line in school history with his 14-14 performance

Landesberg Shines In Collegiate Debut

- Sylvan Landesberg had 28 points in the season-opener against VMI, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his debut
- The previous record was 24 points set by Jeff Lamp in his debut against James Madison on Nov. 25, 1977
- Landesberg's 28 points are tied for the second most in ACC history by a freshman in his first game
- Landesberg is one of only four Cavalier first-years to score 20 points in his first collegiate game
- He is the first Cavalier freshman to lead the team in scoring in a season opener since Mamadi Diane had 17 points in the 2005-06 season opening win over Liberty

Back-to-Back 25 Points for Landesberg

- Sylven Landesberg scored 26 points at Georgia Tech and 25 points vs. Xavier
- Landesberg was the first Cavalier to have consecutive 25-point games since J.R. Reynolds accomplished the feat in both of Virginia's 2007 NCAA Tournament games
- The last Cavalier freshman to score at least 25 points in consecutive games was Chris Williams in 1998-99 (26 vs. Loyola, 26 vs. Delaware)

Tucker Steps Up

- Jamil Tucker has scored in double figures in nine games this season
- At Maryland, he scored a career-high 21 points while tying a career high with four 3-pointers
- Against Longwood, he set career highs with 10 rebounds and three assists and had 11 points for his first career double-double
- At Georgia Tech, he had 15 points, including the 3-pointer that tied the game with 15 seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime

Scott is a Force Inside

- Mike Scott has six double-doubles this season
- He is second in the ACC with 3.7 offensive rebounds per game and ranks eighth overall in rebounding with an average of 7.9 per game
- Scott is shooting .543 from the floor this season, which would rank fourth in the ACC if he had the minimum number of made field goals to qualify (he averages 4.2 FGM/game, 5.0 is the min.)
- At Maryland, Scott went 10-10 from the free throw line

Mike Scott Opens Season With Impressive Performance

- Mike Scott set career highs with 26 points and 18 rebounds in the season opening win over VMI
- Scott tied the school record with 10 offensive rebounds, a mark previously set by Matt Blundin (vs. Clemson 1/9/90), Bryant Stith (vs. Georgia Tech 3/13/92) and Travis Watson (vs. Maryland 1/31/02)
- His 18 rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds vs. Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003

Scott and Landesberg Post UVa's First 25-25 Combo in Over a Year

- Against VMI, Sylven Landesberg (28 pts) and Mike Scott (26 points) became the first Cavaliers to score at least 25 points in the same game in over a year
- The previous game that Virginia had a pair of 25-point scorers was a 71-58 win at NC State on Jan. 24, 2007 when J.R Reynolds had 29 points and Sean Singletary had 27 points

Cavaliers 12th in ACC Preseason Poll

- The Cavaliers were projected 12th in the preseason ACC poll of media
- Sylven Landesberg was second in the voting for Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year

Head Coach Dave Leitao

- 2007 ACC Coach of the Year
- First Virginia coach to win the honor since Terry Holland in 1982
- 60-53 record in his fourth season at Virginia, including a 24-31 mark in the ACC
- Overall record of 140-122 in his ninth season as a head coach

Baker, Diane, Soroye Named Virginia's Captains

- Calvin Baker, Mamadi Diane, and Tunji Soroye are Virginia's captains for 2008-09
- This season marks the first year each player has served as a captain

Virginia Signs Two to Letters of Intent

- The Cavaliers signed two recruits to National Letters of Intent during the November signing period
- Jontel Evans, a 5-11 guard from Hampton, Va., and Tristan Spurlock, a 6-7 forward from Woodbridge, Va., will join the Cavaliers in 2009-10

Sylvan Landesberg scored 28 points, grabbed eight rebounds and had eight assists, and Mike Scott added career highs of 26 points and 18 rebounds to lead Virginia to a season-opening 107-97 victory over VMI at John Paul Jones Arena. Mamadi Diane and Jamil Tucker each added 14 points, and Sammy Zeglinski scored 11 points for the Cavaliers.

The victory was the 11th consecutive season-opening victory for Virginia.

Landesberg's 28 points are the most by a Virginia freshman in his collegiate debut and tied for the second most by an ACC freshman in his first game.

Scott tied a school record with 10 offensive rebounds and his 18 total rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds against Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003.

A 28-9 run gave Virginia a 36-19 lead with 10:14 left to play in the first half, but the Keydets rallied to cut the UVA lead to 51-45 at halftime. Scott had 14 first half points for the Cavaliers, Landesberg had 13 and Tucker 10.

The game was tied 82-82 with 6:47 to play when Virginia went on a 10-2 run to take control of the game. A jumper by Scott gave Virginia the lead for good at 84-82 with 6:30 remaining and two three-pointers by Jeff Jones completed the run. VMI didn't get closer than four points the rest of the game.

The Cavaliers shot 54.4 percent (43-79) from the field, out-rebounded the Keydets 50-35 and had 24 assists. VMI shot 46.8 percent (37-79) from the field, 93.3 percent (14-15) from the free throw line and had 15 steals. Virginia shot 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line.

Twinn brothers Chavis and Travis Holmes led VMI. Chavis Holmes scored a game-high 31 points and Travis Holmes had 20 points. Austin Kenon added 18 points, while Willie Bell and Keith Gabriel each scored 14 points.

"With so many possessions, it is a difficult style to play against. It affected everything that we do: our lineups, holding the big guys out because it would be very difficult for them to guard on the perimeter. They play you against yourself, and it was a difficult preparation for us -- getting us ready to go against what we do every day, so I'm just glad that fortunately we won." - Dave Leitao

Sylvan Landesberg scored on a layup with 13 seconds left in the game to give Virginia the lead for good at 76-75 and then added a free throw six seconds later to account for the final margin of victory as the Cavaliers defeated the University of South Florida 77-75 at John Paul Jones Arena.

Landesberg finished with a team-high 21 points and also had four rebounds and three steals. He is the first Virginia freshman since Gary Forbes in 2003-04 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first two games of the season.

Jamil Tucker added a career-high 15 points for the Cavaliers and led the team with seven rebounds. Mamadi Diane added 13 points, while Mike Scott scored 10 points and had six rebounds.

USF jumped out to a 10-2 lead 5:01 into the game, but UVA battled back and to tie the game 34-34 at halftime. Dominique Jones scored 13 points in the first half for USF and Diane had 10 first half points for the Cavaliers.

Virginia trailed by as many as six points in the second half (61-55 with 9:06 to play) before rallying for the victory. Landesberg and Tucker each scored 12 points in the second half to lead UVA.

The Cavaliers shot 40.3 percent (27-67) from the field, including 26.3 percent (5-19) from three-point range, and 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line. Virginia had eight steals and turned the ball over only 10 times in the game. USF shot 49.2 percent (32-65) from the field, including 33.3 percent (5-15) from three-point range, and 50 percent (6-12) from the free throw line. The Bulls turned the ball over 14 times.

Jones finished with a game-high 23 points to lead USF and Jesus Verdejo scored 22 points. Chris Howard scored 12 points for the Bulls and Alex Rivas Sanchez added 10 points and nine rebounds.

Seth Curry and Kyle Ohman each scored 26 points, and Anthony Smith scored 21 to lead Liberty to an 86-82 victory over Virginia at John Paul Jones Arena.

A three-pointer by Curry at the buzzer gave Liberty a 35-32 halftime lead. The Flames ran off six consecutive points to take a seven-point lead (78-71) with 1:14 left in the game. Virginia closed to within two points (83-81) with 16 seconds remaining to play, but Liberty hung on for the victory.

Virginia out-rebounded the Flames 37-23.

The loss ended the Cavaliers' 36-game November home winning streak, UVA's 16-game winning streak against Big South opponents and Virginia's 15-game winning streak against non-conference in-state opponents.

Syracuse scored 10 consecutive points, the first six on two three-pointers by Andy Rautins, to take a six-point lead at 62-56 with 6:12 remaining in the game and the Orange went on to a 73-70 victory over Virginia at the Carrier Dome. Rautins' second three-pointer in the run gave Syracuse its first lead (58-56 with 7:54 left to play) since a 2-0 lead in the first minute of the game.

Virginia led by as many as 13 points (40-27) with 30 seconds left in the first half after a 9-0 run that featured five points by Calvin Baker and the Cavaliers led by 11 (40-29) at halftime. UVA's biggest lead of the second half was 12 points on two occasions, the last with 16:57 to play in the game (45-33) after a jump shot by Baker.

Sylvan Landesberg led five Virginia players in double figures in scoring with 16 points. Baker and Sammy Zeglinski each scored 14 points, while Mike Scott added 10 points, 10 rebounds and a career-high four assists, and Jerome Meyinsse 10 points and eight rebounds. The double-double was the second of the season for Scott and the fourth of his UVA career.

Four Syracuse players scored in double figures as the Orange remained undefeated at 6-0. Jonny Flynn scored 15 points and had six assists, and Rautins also scored 15 points to lead Syracuse. Eric Devendorf added 14 points and four assists, and Paul Harris scored 13 points and had eight rebounds for the Orange. Arinze Onuaku led Syracuse with 10 rebounds.

Virginia shot 42.2 percent (27-64) from the field for the game, including 28.6 percent (4-14) from three-point range, and 70.6 percent (12-17) from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded the Orange 38-33.

Syracuse shot 46.7 percent (21-45) from the field, including 30.8 percent (4-13) from three-point range, and 71.1 percent (27-38) from the free throw line. The Orange blocked nine Virginia shots.

Jamil Tucker's three-point field goal with 14.7 seconds left in regulation forced overtime and Calvin Baker's driving layup with 10.3 seconds remaining in the overtime period put Virginia ahead for good as the Cavaliers won their Atlantic Coast Conference opener 88-84 at Georgia Tech.

Virginia led by as many as 11 points in the first half after jumping to a 17-6 lead 4:09 into the game. The Cavaliers were ahead by seven (44-37) at halftime behind 14 first-half points by Sylvan Landesberg and 10 by Mustapha Farrakhan.

Georgia Tech opened the second half with a 9-0 run to take the lead and the Yellow Jackets led by as many as five points (69-64) with 3:45 left in regulation before the Cavaliers rallied to send the game to overtime.

Landesberg finished with a game-high total of 26 points, and he also had six rebounds and five assists. Tucker tied his career high with 15 points and had six rebounds, Baker had 13 points and Farrakhan scored a career-high 12 points. Mike Scott had his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds.

Virginia shot 44.3 percent (31-70) from the field, including 39.1 percent (9-23) from three-point range, and 77.3 percent (17-22) from the free throw line.

Gani Lawal led Georgia Tech with 21 points and nine rebounds, while Lewis Clinch and Iman Shumpert each scored 18 points. Alade Aminu had a double-double for the Yellow Jackets with 13 points and 12 rebounds.

Georgia Tech shot 43.1 percent (31-72) from the field, including 33.3 percent (6-18) from three-point range, but the Yellow Jackets made only 48.5 percent (16-33) of their free throw attempts. Georgia Tech out-rebounded Virginia 50-42 and the Yellow Jackets had 20 offensive rebounds.

It was the first overtime victory for the Cavaliers on an opponent's home court since an 84-82 double overtime win at NC State on Feb. 8, 1996.

"It was a terrific game, both teams played well and played to their strengths. They got a lot of inside scoring and attacked the glass. We were able to spread them out offensively and attack. They made some runs, we made some runs and the last two minutes before overtime, with the game hanging in the balance, some of our guys stepped up. To finish it off in overtime was huge. I think overall it speaks to what we have been talking about. We are getting a little bit better, a little more consistent on the defensive end." - Dave Leitao

Xavier out-scored Virginia 23-2 during a 5:55 stretch early in the first half, including a 19-0 run, and went on to an 84-70 victory over the Cavaliers at John Paul Jones Arena.

The Musketeers led by as many as 21 points in the first half and led by 16 (42-26) at halftime. Xavier went on a 13-0 run early in the second half to expand its lead to 28 points (60-32) with 13:00 left to play and the closest Virginia could get after that was 12 points (82-70) with just 38 seconds left in the game.

Sylvan Landesberg scored a game-high 25 points, grabbed seven rebounds and had four assists for the Cavaliers. It was his second consecutive game with at least 25 points after scoring 26 in an 88-84 overtime victory over Georgia Tech on Dec. 28. He is the first Uva freshman to have consecutive games with at least 25 points since Chris Williams during the 1998-99 season.

Mike Scott added 16 points and five rebounds for Virginia. Assane Sene scored six points and had a game-high 11 rebounds for the Cavaliers.

Virginia shot 37.5 percent (24-64) from the field, including 33.3 percent (5-15) from three-point range, and 81.0 percent (17-21) from the free throw line in the game.

Florida State held Virginia to three field goals, 16 points and 13.6 percent (3-22) shooting from the field in the first half in building a 14-point halftime lead (30-16) and the Seminoles went on to a 73-62 victory over the Cavaliers at John Paul Jones Arena.

Florida State took control of the game with a 14-0 run over a 6:24 stretch of the first half to build a 24-5 lead with 6:40 remaining in the half. The Seminoles led by as many as 21 points in the second half.

The Cavaliers' 16 first half points were the fewest they'd scored before halftime since scoring 15 against Connecticut on Nov. 29, 1993, at University Hall. Virginia's three first half field goals were the fewest in a half for the Cavaliers since they made three field goals in the second half at NC State on Feb. 19, 1997.

The closest UVA got to the Seminoles in the second half was the final margin of 11 points.

Sylen Landesberg scored a game-high 24 points and had six rebounds to lead the Cavaliers. It was his ninth 20-point game of the season, tying Virginia's freshman record. Landesberg made all 14 of his free throw attempts in the game, tying for the second best perfect game from the line in UVA history.

Jamil Tucker was the only other UVA player to score in double figures with 10 points. It was Tucker's third consecutive double figure scoring effort, the longest streak of his career.

Virginia shot 35.4 percent (17-48) from the field for the game, including 28.6 percent (4-14) from three-point range, and the Cavaliers made 80.0 percent (24-30) of their free throw attempts.

Toney Douglas led Florida State with 21 points and Solomon Alabi added 10.

Florida State shot 50.0 percent (27-54) from the field, including 53.3 percent (8-15) from three-point range, and 84.6 percent (11-13) from the free throw line.

"The way Florida State plays basketball—systematically and methodically—wore us out and wore us down mentally, starting with the beginning of the game. We have been preaching for the last couple of days about offense. You have to take advantage of every opportunity to score because there just aren't that many" - Dave Leitao

Gerald Henderson scored 16 points in the first half as Duke built a 43-21 halftime lead and the top-ranked Blue Devils went on to a 79-54 victory over Virginia at Cameron Indoor Stadium.

Duke took control of the game with a 20-3 run over a 4:36 span of the first half to build a 34-12 lead with 8:20 left in the half. Nolan Smith added 11 points for Duke in the first half and the Cavaliers committed 17 first-half turnovers.

The Blue Devils led by as many as 27 points in the second half as Virginia lost for the 13th consecutive time at Duke.

Sylen Landesberg scored a game-high 20 points to lead the Cavaliers. He was 8-10 from the field in the game. It was the 10th time during the season that Landesberg scored at least 20 points in a game, establishing a UVA freshman record.

Mike Scott was the only other Virginia player to score in double figures with 10 points. It was the eighth time in the last nine games Scott scored in double figures.

Virginia shot 42.9 percent (21-49) from the field, including 25.0 percent (3-12) from three-point range, and 69.2 percent (9-13) from the free throw line in the game.

Henderson finished with 18 points and four assists to lead Duke. Smith scored 15 points and Jon Scheyer had 11 points and a game-high seven rebounds for the Blue Devils.

Duke shot 46.3 percent (31-67) from the field, including 33.3 percent (9-27) from three-point range, and 57.1 percent (8-14) from the free throw line.

The loss was the fifth in a row for the Cavaliers.

"Simply stated, we played a team that is obviously very good, very talented, and very experienced and on a bit of a mission. Whether it's what they are trying to do with the season or coming off of their last game, they focused on some very specific things to make their train run smoothly. Missed assignments on both offense and defense early really set a bad tone that caused us to turn over the ball a number of times and caused us to have a number of unforced turnovers that obviously equated to us having 17 at halftime. I said during the first TV timeout that the things we talked about and we were executing and preparing for in practice every day really didn't show at all at any point in time in the game." - Dave Leitao

The Eagles led by as many as 22 points in the first half and also led by 22 early in the second half.

It was the most points scored by a UVA freshman since Chris Williams scored 34 points against Liberty on Dec. 8, 1998.


Jones was the only other player to score in double figures for the Cavaliers with 10 points, while Sene had a season and game-high 13 rebounds.
