- The game will begin a four-game homestand to open the season

About the Cavaliers

- The Cavaliers return three starters (Mamadi Diane, Mike Scott, Jeff Jones) from last year's squad
- Virginia went 17-16 last season and reached the CBI semifinals
- The Cavaliers topped Shepherd 87-52 in an exhibition last week at JPJA

About the Keydets

- VMI opened the season Friday with a 111-103 win at Kentucky
- The Keydets have led the nation in scoring in each of the past two seasons
- Last year, VMI averaged 91.3 points per game

Season Openers

- Virginia has won its last 10 season openers and its last 11 home openers
- Overall, the Cavaliers are 83-20 (.806) in season openers
- Last season, Virginia opened the season with a 90-72 win over Vermont
- Dave Leitao is 6-2 in season openers (0-2 at Northeastern, 3-0 at DePaul, 3-0 at Virginia)

Series History

- Virginia leads the series 100-15 (UVa leads 50-7 in Charlottesville)
- Virginia has won the last 23 meetings with VMI's last win in the series during the 1964-65
- UVa's 100 wins over VMI are the most against any opponent
- The teams haven't met since a 78-56 Cavalier win in Lexington in 2003-04

- UVa has won its last 14 games against Big South opponents, dating back to 1998

Last Time Out

- Virginia made its 2008-09 debut with an 87-52 win over Shepherd in an exhibition last week

- UVa lost to McGill 88-83

Head Coach Dave Leitao

• 2007 ACC Coach of the Year

- First Virginia coach to win the honor since Terry Holland in 1982
- 53-42 record in his fourth season at Virginia, including a 23-25 mark in the ACC
- Overall record of 133-111 in his ninth season as a head coach

At Home at John Paul Jones Arena

- Virginia has an all-time record of 29-8 at John Paul Jones Arena
- UVa was 13-7 at home during the 2007-08 season
- The Cavaliers posted a 16-1 home record in 2006-07 in the first season in John Paul Jones Arena
