Today's Game

- The Cavaliers return to ACC play this afternoon as they visit Virginia Tech
- Virginia is looking to open conference play with a 2-0 record for the first time since 1994-95
- That season was also the last time the Cavaliers won their first two ACC road games (FSU, NCSU)

About the Cavaliers

- Virginia is 7-5 (1-0 ACC) after a 74-50 win over Brown on Tuesday
- UVa is led by Sylven Landesberg, who is averaging 18.3 ppg
- Mike Scott has posted five double-doubles this season

About the Hokies

- Virginia Tech is 9-5 this season (4-1 at Cassell Coliseum)
- The Hokies suffered a 69-44 loss at Duke on Sunday in their last outing
- Senior guard/forward A.D. Vassallo leads Virginia Tech with an 18.1 ppg average

Series History

- Virginia leads 78-49 (Virginia Tech leads 26-15 in Blacksburg)
- The Hokies won both of last year's meetings in overtime (70-69 at JPJA, 72-65 at Cassell)
- Virginia last won in Blacksburg in 2005-06 (a 54-49 win)

Close Games

- Eight of Virginia's 12 games this season have been decided by 10 points or less
- Six of those games have been decided by five points or less

• The Cavaliers have four wins this season by 10 points or less, which is just two shy of their total from last season (six)

On the Road in the ACC

• Virginia has won its last two ACC road games (last season's road finale at Georgia Tech and this season's road opener at Georgia Tech)

• It is the first time the Cavaliers have won consecutive ACC road games since a three-game ACC road winning streak in 2006-07 (at NC State, at Clemson, at Maryland)

Last Time Out

- Virginia defeated Brown 74-50 Tuesday night at John Paul Jones Arena
- Mike Scott scored 15 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for his fifth double-double of the season
- Sammy Zeglinski added 14 points for the Cavaliers

Youth is Served

- Freshmen and Sophomores have made 39 of the 60 starts this season for the Cavaliers
- Freshmen and Sophomores have scored 52.9 ppg (69.6 % of offense) and average 24.3 rebounds a game (65.8 % of team total)

• Freshmen and Sophomores have led the team in scoring in 11 of 12 games this season and led the team in rebounding in nine of 12 games this season

Bench Production

• Virginia has gotten solid production from its bench this season, averaging 23.7 points, 12.2 rebounds and 3.7 assists per game off the bench

• Virginia had 51 points off the bench against USF, the most bench points in a game for the Cavaliers since scoring 52 off the bench against Maryland on March 1, 1986

• This season the Cavaliers have gotten 11 double-digit scoring performances off the bench

Difficult Schedule for the Cavaliers

• Eight of Virginia's opponents are ranked and three others are receiving votes in this week's Associated Press poll

- Virginia's first 12 opponents have a combined 111-63 record this season
- 12 of Virginia's first 13 opponents this season entered the game against the Cavaliers with a .500 or better record

• 16 of 27 regular season games will be against 2008 postseason teams (seven vs. NCAA teams, eight vs. NIT teams, one vs. CBI team)

• 21 of 27 games will be televised (the other six available online on ACC Select)

Head Coach Dave Leitao

- 2007 ACC Coach of the Year
- First Virginia coach to win the honor since Terry Holland in 1982
- 60-47 record in his fourth season at Virginia, including a 24-25 mark in the ACC
- Overall record of 140-116 in his ninth season as a head coach

At Home at John Paul Jones Arena

- Virginia has an all-time record of 35-11 at John Paul Jones Arena
- UVa was 13-7 at home during the 2007-08 season
- The Cavaliers posted a 16-1 home record in 2006-07 in the first season in John Paul Jones Arena

Protecting the Ball

• Virginia committed just seven turnovers in Tuesday's win over Brown

• The total was the Cavaliers' fewest of the season and the fewest since committing seven in a 95-93 loss at Miami last season (3/1/08)

Back-to-Back 25 Points for Landesberg

• Sylven Landesberg scored 26 points at Georgia Tech and 25 points vs. Xavier

- Landesberg was the first Cavalier to have consecutive 25-point games since J.R. Reynolds ac-
- complsihed the feat in both of Virginia's 2007 NCAA Tournament games
- The last Cavalier freshman to score at least 25 points in consecutive games was Chris Williams in 1998-99 (26 vs. Loyola, 26 vs. Delaware)

Landesberg Named ACC Rookie of the Week ... Again

 Sylven Landesberg was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on Dec. 30, the fourth time he has received the honor

Landesberg also was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Nov. 17, Nov. 24, and Dec. 22

• He is the first Cavalier to win the award in consecutive weeks since Sean Singletary won it on Feb. 14, 2005 and Feb. 21, 2005

• He was the first player to win the award in each of the first two weeks of the season since Georgia Tech's Chris Bosh in 2002-03

Landesberg Makes Immediate Impact

• At 18.3 ppg, Sylven Landesberg is the third-leading scorer in the ACC and the second-leading freshman scorer in the nation

- He has seven 20-point games this season and the Cavaliers are 5-2 in those games
- His seven 20-point games already rank third in school history by a freshman

• He is tied for scoring the second most points in the first 12 games of a freshman season among all Cavalier freshmen in history

• At Georgia Tech, Landesberg scored 26 points, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his ACC debut (previous record was 22 by Roger Mason, Jr. vs. Duke in 1999-00)

• Landesberg scored in double figures in the first eight games of the season, the second longest streak by a UVa freshman to open a career

• With 28 points vs. VMI, 21 points vs. USF and 22 points vs. Radford, Landesberg became the first Cavalier freshman to open his career with three 20-point games

• He was the first Cavalier freshman since Tom Sheehey in 1983-84 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first three games of the season

• He was only the second freshman in ACC history to score at least 20 points in the first three games of his career (Georgia Tech's Kenny Anderson scored at least 20 points in his first six career games in 1989-90)

• He was the first Cavalier player to score 20 or more points in the first three games of a season since Roger Mason, Jr. in 2001-02

Getting to the Line

• Sylven Landesberg ranks first in the ACC with 8.0 free throw attempts per game

 Landesberg has made 11 "old-fashioned" three-point plays this season (the rest of the team has combined for six)

• Through the first 12 games of last season, Sean Singletary led Virginia with six "and one" plays

Landesberg Shines In Collegiate Debut

 Sylven Landesberg had 28 points in the seasonopener against VMI, the most by a Cavalier freshman in his debut

•The previous record was 24 points set by Jeff Lamp in his debut against James Madison on Nov. 25, 1977 Landesberg's 28 points are tied for the second most

in ACC history by a freshman in his first game • Landesberg is one of only four Cavalier first-years

to score 20 points in his first collegiate game

• His 28 points are the most by a UVa freshman in any game since Chris Williams had 34 points vs. Liberty on Dec. 8, 1998

• He is the first Cavalier freshman to lead the team in scoring in a season opener since Mamadi Diane had 17 points in the 2005-06 season opening win over Liberty

Cleaning the Glass

• Virginia had a strong performance on the boards against Longwood, outrebounding the Lancers 49-23

• It was Virginia's largest rebounding margin since outrebounding Penn 56-26 last season

Zeglinski Scores Big Against Liberty

- Sammy Zeglinski scored a career-high 24 points, all in the second half, against Liberty
- He shot 8-13 from the floor, including 6-10 from 3-point range
- His 24 second half points are a John Paul Jones Arena record

Tucker Steps Up

- Jamil Tucker has set numerous career highs this season
- Against VMI, Tucker tied his previous career high with 14 points
- He topped that mark with a new career-high 15 points against USF
- At Minnesota, he scored a team-high 12 points on a career-high four 3-pointers

• Against Longwood, he set career highs with 10 rebounds and three assists and had 11 points for his first career double-double

• At Georgia Tech, he tied his career high with 15 points, including the 3-pointer that tied the game with 15 seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime

Mike Scott Opens Season With Impressive Performance

Mike Scott set career highs with 26 points and 18 rebounds in the season opening win over VMI
Scott tied the school record with 10 offensive rebounds, a mark previously set by Matt Blundin (vs. Clemson 1/9/90), Bryant Stith (vs. Georgia Tech 3/13/92) and Travis Watson (vs. Maryland 1/31/02)

• His 18 rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds vs. Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003

Scott and Landesberg Post UVa's First 25-25 Combo in Over a Year

• Against VMI, Sylven Landesberg (28 pts) and Mike Scott (26 points) became the first Cavaliers to score at least 25 points in the same game in over a year

• The previous game that Virginia had a pair of 25-point scorers was a 71-58 win at NC State on Jan. 24, 2007 when J.R Reynolds had 29 points and Sean Singletary had 27 points

Cavaliers 12th in ACC Preseason Poll

- The Cavaliers were projected 12th in the preseason ACC poll of media
- Sylven Landesberg was second in the voting for Preseason ACC Rookie of the Year

Virginia Visited Canada in August

- The Cavaliers went on a trip to Canada in August to play three games
- Virginia went 2-1 on the trip
- UVa defeated St. Lawrence College (Ont.) 107-60
- UVa defeated Concordia 85-70
- UVa lost to McGill 88-83

• Four players averaged in double figures on the trip (Calvin Baker - 16.0, Jeff Jones -13.7, Sylven Landesberg - 12.0, Mike Scott - 10.7)

Baker, Diane, Soroye Named Virginia's Captains

- Calvin Baker, Mamadi Diane, and Tunji Soroye are Virginia's captains for 2008-09
- This season marks the first year each player has served as a captain

Virginia Signs Two to Letters of Intent

• The Cavaliers signed two recruits to National Letters of Intent during the November signing period

• Jontel Evans, a 5-11 guard from Hampton, Va., and Tristan Spurlock, a 6-7 forward from Woodbridge, Va., will join the Cavaliers in 2009-10

Sylven Landesberg scored 28 points, grabbed eight rebounds and had eight assists, and Mike Scott added career highs of 26 points and 18 rebounds to lead Virginia to a season-opening 107-97 victory over VMI at John Paul Jones Arena. Mamadi Diane and Jamil Tucker each added 14 points, and Sammy Zeglinski scored 11 points for the Cavaliers. The victory was the 11th consecutive season-

opening victory for Virginia.

Landesberg's 28 points are the most by a Virginia freshman in his collegiate debut and tied for the second most by an ACC freshman in his first game.

Scott tied a school record with 10 offensive rebounds and his 18 total rebounds were the most by a Cavalier since Travis Watson had 20 rebounds against Wofford on Jan. 2, 2003.

A 28-9 run gave Virginia a 36-19 lead with 10:14 left to play in the first half, but the Keydets rallied to cut the UVa lead to 51-45 at halftime. Scott had 14 first half points for the Cavaliers, Landesberg had 13 and Tucker 10.

The game was tied 82-82 with 6:47 to play when Virginia went on a 10-2 run to take control of the game. A jumper by Scott gave Virginia the lead for good at 84-82 with 6:30 remaining and two three-pointers by Jeff Jones completed the run. VMI didn't get closer than four points the rest of the game.

The Cavaliers shot 54.4 percent (43-79) from the field, out-rebounded the Keydets 50-35 and had 24 assists. VMI shot 46.8 percent (37-79) from the field, 93.3 percent (14-15) from the free throw line and had 15 steals. Virginia shot 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line.

Twin brothers Chavis and Travis Holmes led VMI. Chavis Holmes scored a game-high 31 points and Travis Holmes had 20 points. Austin Kenon added 18 points, while Willie Bell and Keith Gabriel each scored 14 points.

Sylven Landesberg scored on a layup with 13 seconds left in the game to give Virginia the lead for good at 76-75 and then added a free throw six seconds later to account for the final margin of victory as the Cavaliers defeated the University of South Florida 77-75 at John Paul Jones Arena.

Landesberg finished with a team-high 21 points and also had four rebounds and three steals. He is the first Virginia freshman since Gary Forbes in 2003-04 to lead the team in scoring in each of the first two games of the season.

Jamil Tucker added a career-high 15 points for the Cavaliers and led the team with seven rebounds. Mamadi Diane added 13 points, while Mike Scott scored 10 points and had six rebounds.

USF jumped out to a 10-2 lead 5:01 into the game, but UVa battled back and to tie the game 34-34 at halftime. Dominique Jones scored 13 points in the first half for USF and Diane had 10 first half points for the Cavaliers.

Virginia trailed by as many as six points in the second half (61-55 with 9:06 to play) before rallying for the victory. Landesberg and Tucker each scored 12 points in the second half to lead UVa.

The Cavaliers shot 40.3 percent (27-67) from the field, including 26.3 percent (5-19) from threepoint range, and 64.3 percent (18-28) from the free throw line. Virginia had eight steals and turned the ball over only 10 times in the game. USF shot 49.2 percent (32-65) from the field, including 33.3 percent (5-15) from three-point range, and 50 percent (6-12) from the free throw line. The Bulls turned the ball over 14 times.

Jones finished with a game-high 23 points to lead USF and Jesus Verdejo scored 22 points. Chris Howard scored 12 points for the Bulls and Alex Rivas Sanchez added 10 points and nine rebounds.

"Without playing particularly well today, we still were able to win. And were able do it a little bit 'gutty'. The Highlanders blocked 10 of the Cavaliers' shots in the game.

Seth Curry and Kyle Ohman each scored 26 points, and Anthony Smith scored 21 to lead Liberty to an 86-82 victory over Virginia at John Paul Jones Arena.

The Flames shot 56.6 percent (30-53) from the field for the game, including 50 percent (13-26) from three-point range. In the second half, Liberty shot 69.6 percent (16-23) from the field, including 60 percent (6-10) from three-point range. The Flames also shot 65 percent (13-20) from the free throw line, 72.2 percent (13-18) in the second half.

Sammy Zeglinski made the first start of his collegiate career and scored a career-high 24 points to lead the Cavaliers. Zeglinski also had a career high with six three-point field goals. Sylven Landesberg scored 17 points and had nine rebounds, Calvin Baker scored 15 points and had five assists, and Jeff Jones scored 10 points for Virginia. Mike Scott had a game-high 17 rebounds for the Cavaliers.

UVa shot 46.6 percent (27-58) from the field, including 40.6 percent (13-32) from three-point range, and 78.9 percent (15-19) from the free throw line

A three-pointer by Curry at the buzzer gave Liberty a 35-32 halftime lead. The Flames ran off six consecutive points to take a seven-point lead (78-71) with 1:14 left in the game. Virginia closed to within two points (83-81) with 16 seconds remaining to play, but Liberty hung on for the victory. Virginia out-rebounded the Flames 37-23.

The loss ended the Cavaliers' 36-game November home winning streak, UVa's 16-game winning streak against Big South opponents and Virginia's 15-game winning streak against non-conference in-state opponents.

Syracuse scored 10 consecutive points, the first six on two three-pointers by Andy Rautins, to take a six-point lead at 62-56 with 6:12 remaining in the game and the Orange went on to a 73-70 victory over Virginia at the Carrier Dome. Rautins' second three-pointer in the run gave Syracuse its first lead (58-56 with 7:54 left to play) since a 2-0 lead in the first minute of the game.

Virginia led by as many as 13 points (40-27) with 30 seconds left in the first half after a 9-0 run that featured five points by Calvin Baker and the Cavaliers led by 11 (40-29) at halftime. UVa's biggest lead of the second half was 12 points on two occasions, the last with 16:57 to play in the game (45-33) after a jump shot by Baker.

Sylven Landesberg led five Virginia players in double figures in scoring with 16 points. Baker and Sammy Zeglinski each scored 14 points, while Mike Scott added 10 points, 10 rebounds and a career-high four assists, and Jerome Meyinsse 10 points and eight rebounds. The double-double was the second of the season for Scott and the fourth of his UVa career.

Four Syracuse players scored in double figures as the Orange remained undefeated at 6-0. Jonny Flynn scored 15 points and had six assists, and Rautins also scored 15 points to lead Syracuse. Eric Devendorf added 14 points and four assists, and Paul Harris scored 13 points and had eight rebounds for the Orange. Arinze Onuaku led Syracuse with 10 rebounds.

Virginia shot 42.2 percent (27-64) from the field for the game, including 28.6 percent (4-14) from three-point range, and 70.6 percent (12-17) from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded the Orange 38-33.

Syracuse shot 46.7 percent (21-45) from the field, including 30.8 percent (4-13) from three-point range, and 71.1 percent (27-38) from the free throw line. The Orange blocked nine Virginia shots.

Virginia lost its third consecutive game when the Cavaliers dropped a 66-56 decision at Minnesota in the ACC-Big Ten Challenge. UVa shot just 31.4 percent (16-51) from the field and turned the ball over 19 times in the loss to the Golden Gophers.

Minnesota made two runs that helped the Golden Gophers take control of the game. The first came with Virginia leading by five points at 16-11.

Starting with a three-pointer by Blake Hoffarber with 8:13 remaining in the first half, Minnesota outscored the Cavaliers 15-2 over a span of 2:43 to take a 26-18 lead with 5:30 left in the half.

The Cavaliers cut the lead to three points (32-29) at halftime and narrowed the deficit to one (32-31) on two free throws by Calvin Baker with 18:48 to play in the game. Minnesota then went on a 13-2 run over a span of 4:14 to take a 12-point lead at 45-33 with 13:42 left to play.

UVa pulled within four points at 48-44 with 10:17 remaining in the game after an 11-3 run of its own and had two possessions to draw closer, but the Cavaliers were unable to score on either possession.

Jamil Tucker scored a team-high 12 points on a career-high four three-point field goals to lead Virginia in scoring. Sylven Landesberg scored 10 points and had six rebounds for the Cavaliers, and Sammy Zeglinski added 10 points.

UVa shot 30 percent (6-20) from three-point range and 81.8 percent (18-22) from the free throw line. The Cavaliers out-rebounded Minnesota 40-32.

Colton Iverson led the Golden Gophers with game-high totals of 14 points and seven rebounds. Lawrence Westbrook scored 13 points for Minnesota and Hoffarber added 12 points.

Minnesota shot 41.5 percent (22-53) from the field, including 25 percent (6-24) from three-point range, and 76.2 percent (16-21) from the free throw line. The Golden Gophers had 10 steals in the game, blocked seven shots and turned the ball over 12 times

Georgia Tech shot 43.1 percent (31-72) from the field, including 33.3 percent (6-18) from three-point range, but the Yellow Jackets made only 48.5 percent (16-33) of their free throw attempts. Georgia Tech out-rebounded Virginia 50-42 and the Yellow Jackets had 20 offensive rebounds.

It was the first overtime victory for the Cavaliers on an opponent's home court since an 84-82 double overtime win at NC State on Feb. 8, 1996.

Xavier out-scored Virginia 23-2 during a 5:55 stretch early in the first half, including a 19-0 run, and went on to an 84-70 victory over the Cavaliers at John Paul Jones Arena.

The Musketeers led by as many as 21 points in the first half and led by 16 (42-26) at halftime. Xavier went on a 13-0 run early in the second half to expand its lead to 28 points (60-32) with 13:00 left to play and the closest Virginia could get after that was 12 points (82-70) with just 38 seconds left in the game.

Sylven Landesberg scored a game-high 25 points, grabbed seven rebounds and had four assists for the Cavaliers. It was his second consecutive game with at least 25 points after scoring 26 in an 88-84 overtime victory over Georgia Tech on Dec. 28. He is the first UVa freshman to have consecutive games with at least 25 points since Chris Williams during the 1998-99 season.

Mike Scott added 16 points and five rebounds for Virginia. Assane Sene scored six points and had a game-high 11 rebounds for the Cavaliers.

Virginia shot 37.5 percent (24-64) from the field, including 33.3 percent (5-15) from three-point range, and 81.0 percent (17-21) from the free throw line in the game.

B.J. Raymond scored 24 points and had six rebounds to lead Xavier. Kenny Frease had 13 points and eight rebounds for the Musketeers, and Dante Jackson added 13 points.

Xavier shot 44.6 percent (29-65) from the field for the game, including 40.9 percent (9-22) from threepoint range, and 68.0 percent (17-25) from the free throw line. The Musketeers out-rebounded Virginia 44-35 and Xavier got 37 points from its bench.
