TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Virginia tips-off the 2009-10 season tonight when it hosts Longwood
- It is the debut of new Virginia head coach Tony Bennett, the 11th head coach in the program's history
- The Cavaliers look to win their 12th consecutive season opener

SERIES HISTORY:

- Tonight is the fifth all-time meeting between the schools
- The teams are playing for the fifth consecutive season
- Virginia has won all four previous meetings, all played in Charlottesville
- The Cavaliers won last year's meeting 90-61
- Sylven Landesberg (20 pts) led four Cavaliers in double-figure scoring in last season's meeting

SEASON OPENERS:

- Virginia has won its last 11 season openers and its last 12 home openers
- Overall, the Cavaliers are 84-20 (.808) in season openers
- Last season, Virginia opened the season with a 107-97 win over VMI
- Head Coach Tony Bennett was 3-0 in season openers while at Washington St.
- It is the 11th consecutive season the Cavaliers have opened at home

COACHING DEBUTS:

- Tonight's game is the debut of new UVa head coach Tony Bennett
- Virginia's previous 10 head coaches were 7-3 in the first game of their UVa tenure (wins by Henry Lannigan, Gus Tebell, Evan "Bus" Male, Terry Holland, Jeff Jones, Pete Gillen and Dave Leitao)

'HOOS BACK:

- Virginia returns 11 letterwinners, including all five starters, from 2008-09
- UVa is the only team in the ACC to return all five starters
- Only twice have the Cavaliers returned all five starters, 1990-91 and 2006-07, and in both years the team made the NCAA Tournament
- Virginia returns 90.5 percent of its scoring and 89.9 percent of its rebounding

CAVALIERS 11TH IN ACC POLL:

 Virginia was picked 11th in the ACC preseason poll of media attending ACC Operation Basketball on Oct. 25

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH:

- Since the 1999-2000 season, Virginia has a 33-7 record against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia (28-3 vs. non-conference opponents)
- The Cavaliers are 24-2 at home against in-state foes during that time
- UVa has a 12-2 record against in-state opponents at John Paul Jones Arena

LANDESBERG ON WATCH LISTS:

- Sophomore guard Sylven Landesberg has been named to a pair of preseason watch lists
- He is a preseason candidate for both the Naismith and Wooden awards
- Last season he led Virginia in scoring at 16.6 ppg as a freshman
- Landesberg was the 2008-09 ACC Rookie of the Year

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE:

- Four of Virginia's opponents this season (North Carolina, Duke, Georgia Tech, Clemson) are ranked in the preseason AP poll, as is Kentucky (a potential opponent in Cancun)
- Four other opponents (Maryland, Florida State, Wake Forest, Boston College) are receiving votes

BAKER SIDELINED:

- Calvin Baker had arthroscopic surgery on Oct. 27 to remove a loose piece of cartilage in his right knee.
- He is expected to be out 2-3 weeks following the surgery

TUCKER TAKES LEAVE OF ABSENCE:

- Jamil Tucker is taking an indefinite leave of absence from the team to focus on personal matters
- Head coach Tony Bennett announced the leave on Nov. 11

SENE SUSPENDED:

- Assane Sene has been suspended for the first three games of the 2009-10 regular season by men's head basketball coach Tony Bennett for conduct detrimental to the team.
- He will miss tonight's game vs. Longwood, the Cavaliers' game at South Florida (Nov. 16) and a home game with Rider (Nov. 19).

UP NEXT:

- The Cavaliers travel to Tampa for a game at South Florida on Monday
- It is the second meeting all-time between the schools, with Virginia winning 77-75 over USF last season at John Paul Jones Arena
- Virginia will be looking to snap a 10-game losing streak in the state of Florida, dating back to 2001
