TONIGHT'S GAME

- Virginia opens the 2010-11 regular season tonight as it hosts William & Mary
- It is the 12th consecutive year the Cavaliers have opened a season at home

SERIES HISTORY

- 79th all-time time meeting
- UVa leads 52-26 overall (36-9 in Charlottesville, first meeting at JPJA)
- Virginia has won the last eight meetings and 14 of the last 15
- The teams haven't met since 2003-04 (84-71 UVa win at University Hall)

SEASON OPENERS

- Virginia has won its last 12 season openers and its last 13 home openers
- Overall, the Cavaliers are 85-20 in season openers
- Last season, Virginia opened the season with an 85-72 win over Longwood
- Head Coach Tony Bennett is 4-0 in season openers (1-0 at UVa, 3-0 at WSU)
- It is the 12th consecutive season the Cavaliers have opened at home

AGAINST THE COMMONWEALTH

- Since the 1999-2000 season, Virginia has a 34-9 record against teams from the Commonwealth of Virginia (28-2 vs. non-conference opponents)
- The Cavaliers are 26-3 at home against in-state foes during that time
- UVa has a 14-3 record against in-state opponents at John Paul Jones Arena

AGAINST THE CAA

- Tonight's game is UVa's only regular-season game against a CAA opponent
- Virginia has a 105-34 all-time record against current members of the CAA (10-1 vs. Delaware, 1-0 vs. Drexel, 6-0 vs. George Mason, 1-2 vs. Hofstra, 8-0 vs. James Madison, 3-0 vs. UNCW, 1-0 vs. Northeastern, 9-4 vs. Old Dominion, 4-0 vs. Towson, 10-1 vs. VCU, 52-26 vs. William & Mary)
- The Cavaliers last played a CAA school when they defeated UNCW 69-67 last season
- Virginia is 3-0 vs. the CAA at JPJA (def. Drexel in 07-08, def. ODU in 07-08, def. UNCW 69-67 in 09-10)

- Virginia topped Roanoke College 82-50 in an exhibition game Saturday at JPJA
- Mike Scott led the Cavaliers with 16 points and seven rebounds
- KT Harrell and Joe Harris each scored 10 points

CAVALIERS 11TH IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- Virginia was selected 11th in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball
- Reigning NCAA Champion Duke was the preseason favorite, followed by Virginia Tech, North Carolina, NC State, Florida State, Maryland, Clemson, Miami, Georgia Tech, Boston College, Virginia and Wake Forest

YOUNG CAVALIERS

- · Seven of Virginia's 13 players are first years
- The seven true freshmen are a program record, breaking the previous high of six in 1989-90 (Blair Ford, Chris Havlicek, Ted Jeffries, Terry Kirby, Doug Smith, Shawn Wilson) and 2004-05 (T.J. Bannister, Jason Cain, Gary Forbes, Donte Minter, Vince Redd and J.R. Reynolds)

'HOOS BACK

- Six players return from last season's team that went 15-16 (5-11 ACC)
- Mike Scott is UVa's leading returning scorer (12.0 ppg) and rebounder (7.2 rbg)
- Sammy Zeglinski, UVa's leader in assists (80), steals (38) and 3-point field goals (61) also returns
- All six returning players averaged over 12.0 minutes per game last season

ZEGLINSKI OUT

- Sammy Zeglinski had an operation on Oct. 19 involving cartilage work on his left knee
- · He is expected to be out approximately eight weeks

SCOTT DOUBLING IT UP

- Mike Scott enters the season with 18 career double-doubles (ranks 12th in UVa history)
- He had eight double-doubles last season

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- Virginia will play at least 11 games against teams that participated in the 2010 NCAA
 Tournament
- UVa will play at least five games against teams that participated in the 2010 National Invitation Tournament

AT JOHN PAUL JONES ARENA

- Virginia is 49-22 all-time at John Paul Jones Arena
- The Cavaliers were 11-6 at JPJA last season

TRI-CAPTAINS NAMED

- Mustapha Farrakhan, Mike Scott and Will Sherrill are the tri-captains for the 2010-11 season
- The three players make up this year's senior class

McKAY TO PARTICIPATE IN "SHOTS FROM THE HEART"

- Associate Head Coach Ritchie McKay is participating in "Shots from the Heart", a project designed to raise awareness for the growing problem of heart disease
- College basketball coaches will compete against one another in a free throw shooting tournament, which will benefit the American Heart Association
- The event will also pay tribute to the late Skip Prosser who passed away on July 26, 2007 of a heart attack
- McKay's first round matchup in the assistant coaches division is against Charles Baker of Campbell
