TONIGHT'S GAME

- UVa concludes a season-opening two-game homestand tonight as it hosts USC Upstate
- After tonight, the Cavaliers play their next six games away from home

SERIES HISTORY

- First all-time meeting
- USC Upstate is the first of at least four first-time opponents on UVa's schedule
- The Cavaliers have won their last 23 games against a first-time opponent, dating back to a loss to Gonzaga in the 2001 NCAA Tournament

AGAINST THE ATLANTIC SUN

- Tonight's game is UVa's only regular-season game against an A-Sun opponent
- UVa is 3-0 against the Atlantic-Sun (def. Louisiana-Monroe in 1978-79, College of Charleston in 1992-93, Gardner-Webb in 2002-03 -- all have since left the A-Sun)
- Virginia has a 8-1 all-time record against current members of the A-Sun, with all games coming before the opponents joined the Atlantic Sun (1-0 vs. Belmont, 3-0 vs. East Tennessee State, 3-0 vs. Jacksonville, 1-1 vs, Stetson)
- USC Upstate is the first Atlantic Sun team to visit John Paul Jones Arena

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia opened the season with a 76-52 win over William & Mary on Friday
- Billy Baron led the Cavaliers with 19 points (6-8 FG, 5-6 3FG)
- Mike Scott had 18 points and nine rebounds
- KT Harrell (13 pts) and Mustapha Farrakhan (10 pts) also scored in double figures
- It was Virginia's 13th consecutive season-opening win

SHARP-SHOOTING 'HOOS

- Virginia shot over 50% (52.2%, 12-23) from 3-point range against William & Mary
- It was UVa's first game over 50% from behind the arc since going 7-12 last season against Texas-Pan American
- 12 3-pointers were the most UVa has made since making 13 vs. Liberty in 2008-09
- Against W&M, Billy Baron had the highest Cavalier three-point shooting percentage in a game (83.3 percent, 5-6) since Mamadi Diane (83.3 percent, 5-6) against Arizona on November 12, 2006 (minimum of five attempts)

FIRST-YEARS SHINE IN DEBUT

- The Cavalier first-years made an impact in their collegiate debut against William & Mary
- Billy Baron, KT Harrell, Will Regan, Joe Harris, Akil Mitchell and Thomas Rogers combined for 37 points and 10 rebounds against the Tribe
- It was the most points scored by Cavalier first-years in a season opener since 2003-04 when the Cavalier freshmen combined for 40 points against Mt. St. Mary's (Gary Forbes-21, Donte Minter-12, J.R. Reynolds-7)
- Baron (19 pts) and Harrell (13) were the first Virginia freshman duo to score in double figures in an opener since 2005-06 (Mamadi Diane 17, Lars Mikalauskas 14 vs. Liberty)

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

- Virginia had just eight turnovers against William & Mary, the 16th time in 32 games under Tony Bennett that UVa has had 10 or fewer turnovers
- Last season the Cavaliers ranked first in the ACC and 13th nationally in fewest turnovers per game at 10.7

70 IS A MAGIC NUMBER

- Under Tony Bennett, Virginia is 12-1 when scoring at least 70 points
- The Cavaliers are 4-15 over the past two seasons when scoring under 70 points

CAVALIERS 11TH IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

- Virginia was selected 11th in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball
- Reigning NCAA Champion Duke was the preseason favorite, followed by Virginia Tech, North Carolina, NC State, Florida State, Maryland, Clemson, Miami, Georgia Tech, Boston College, Virginia and Wake Forest

YOUNG CAVALIERS

- Seven of Virginia's 13 players are first years
- The seven true freshmen are a program record, breaking the previous high of six in 1989-90 (Blair Ford, Chris Havlicek, Ted Jeffries, Terry Kirby, Doug Smith, Shawn Wilson) and 2004-05 (T.J. Bannister, Jason Cain, Gary Forbes, Donte Minter, Vince Redd and J.R. Reynolds)

'HOOS BACK

- Six players return from last season's team that went 15-16 (5-11 ACC)
- Mike Scott is UVa's leading returning scorer (12.0 ppg) and rebounder (7.2 rbg)
- Sammy Zeglinski, UVa's leader in assists (80), steals (38) and 3-point field goals (61) also returns
- All six returning players averaged over 12.0 minutes per game last season

ZEGLINSKI OUT

- Sammy Zeglinski had an operation on Oct. 19 involving cartilage work on his left knee
- He is expected to be out approximately eight weeks

JOHNSON TO REDSHIRT

- Freshman forward James Johnson is expected to redshirt this season
- Virginia head coach Tony Bennett indicated that after Virginia's game with William & Mary on Nov. 12

SCOTT DOUBLING IT UP

- Mike Scott has 18 career double-doubles (ranks 12th in UVa history)
- He had eight double-doubles last season

CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

- Virginia will play at least 11 games against teams that participated in the 2010 NCAA Tournament
- UVa will play at least five games against teams that participated in the 2010 National Invitation Tournament

AT JOHN PAUL JONES ARENA

- Virginia is 50-22 all-time at John Paul Jones Arena
- The Cavaliers were 11-6 at JPJA last season

TRI-CAPTAINS NAMED

- Mustapha Farrakhan, Mike Scott and Will Sherrill are the tri-captains for the 2010-11 season
- The three players make up this year's senior class

McKAY TO PARTICIPATE IN "SHOTS FROM THE HEART"

- Associate Head Coach Ritchie McKay is participating in "Shots from the Heart", a project designed to raise awareness for the growing problem of heart disease
- College basketball coaches will compete against one another in a free throw shooting tournament, which will benefit the American Heart Association
- The event will also pay tribute to the late Skip Prosser who passed away on July 26, 2007 of a heart attack
- McKay's first round matchup in the assistant coaches division is against Charles Baker of Campbell

THREE SIGN WITH VIRGINIA

- UVa signed three players to National Letters of Intent for the 2011 recruiting class
- The three players are 6-8 forward Darion Atkins of Clinton, Md.; 6-5 guard Malcolm Brogdon of Norcross, Ga.; and 6-7 wing Paul Jesperson of Merrill, Wisc.
