FOR OPENERS

- The winner of tonight's game advances to the NIT Season Tip-Off semifinals in Madison Square Garden on Wednesday, Nov. 21.
- The winner of the Virginia and Delaware matchup will play the winner of Kansas State and Alabama-Huntsville at either 7 or 9:30 p.m. on Nov. 21.
- Junior guard Joe Harris has led Virginia in scoring in each of the first two games.

LAST TIME OUT

- Virginia defeated Fairfield, 54-45, as the Cavs improved to 4-0 in home openers under head coach Tony Bennett.
- UVa also improved to 16-0 in home openers since 1997.
- Joe Harris (15), Akil Mitchell (12) and Evan Nolte (11) led UVa in scoring.
- Mitchell and Harris led the rebounding effort with eight and seven boards, respectively.
- Darion Atkins and Paul Jespersen made their first career starts, replacing Justin Anderson and Mike Tobey in the starting lineup.

SERIES HISTORY

- UVa sports a 10-1 career mark, including an eight-game winning streak, against Delaware.
- The teams are meeting for the first time since Dec. 27, 1998, when UVa won 72-64 in Charlottesville.
- Delaware's lone win against Virginia was an 89-88 decision back on Jan. 29, 1962.

AGAINST THE CAA

- Delaware is the second of three Colonial Athletic Association opponents on UVa's 2012-13 schedule.
- The Cavaliers lost, 63-59, at George Mason of the CAA to begin this season.
- UVa plays Old Dominion of the CAA on Dec. 22.

- UVA is 99-34 all-time against current CAA members (10-1 vs. Delaware, 2-0 vs. Drexel, 7-1 vs. George Mason, 1-2 vs. Hofstra, 8-0 vs. James Madison, 3-0 vs. UNCW, 1-0 vs. Northeastern, 9-4 vs. Old Dominion, 5-0 vs. Towson and 53-26 vs. William & Mary).

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME AT JPJ

- Virginia is 73-31 (.702) in seven seasons at John Paul Jones Arena.
- The Cavs are 1-0 this season at JPJ after posting a 13-3 record last season
- Virginia is 36-15 (.706) at home under Tony Bennett .

MORE ABOUT THE NIT SEASON TIP-OFF

- Virginia is one of four teams to host a pair of games during the preliminary rounds of the NIT Season Tipoff.
- The team that posts two wins at each of the four sites advances to the semifinals at Madison Square Garden in New York City on Nov. 21.
- Virginia will host the consolation rounds on Nov. 19-20 if they lose either game on Nov. 12-13.

ALL-TIME AT MADISON SQUARE GARDEN

- With a win over Delaware, Virginia would make its 13th appearance and first since Dec. 4, 1999, at Madison Square Garden.
- UVA is 5-7 all-time at Madison Square Garden.
- Virginia has won three of its last four games at the World's Most Famous Arena.
- The Cavaliers captured the 1980 and 1992 NIT titles at Madison Square Garden.

HEAD COACH TONY BENNETT

- Head coach Tony Bennett has posted a 54-42 mark in four seasons at UVA.
- Bennett has a 123-75 record, including a 69-33 record at Washington State, in seven seasons of collegiate coaching.
- Bennett guided the Cavaliers to their first NCAA Tournament since 2007 last season, and UVA's 22 wins were the most since 25 in 1994-95.
- UVA's nine ACC wins in 2011-12 were its most since 11 in 2006-07.
- Bennett is one of 18 Division I head coaches who played in the NBA.

EVANS AND BROGDON MISS FIRST TWO GAMES

- Senior guard Jontel Evans, an ACC All-Defensive Team member last season, and Malcolm Brogdon have missed the first two games with injuries.
- Evans tallied 7.3 points and 3.9 assists per game last season, while Brogdon averaged 6.7 points and 2.8 rebounds per game.

FRESHMEN GROWING UP

- Four Virginia freshmen (Justin Anderson, Taylor Barnette, Evan Nolte and Mike Tobey) have seen action this season.
- Nolte leads the newcomers in scoring at 8.5 points per game, while Anderson leads the team in assists at 3.5 per game.
- UVA started three freshmen (Anderson, Tobey and Barnette) in its season-opening game vs. George Mason for the first time in school history.

NO ORDINARY JOE

- Joe Harris is averaging a career-high 17 points, 7.5 rebounds and 3.0 assists per game this season.
- Harris led UVA with 19 points at George Mason and 15 points vs. Fairfield.
- Harris has led the team in scoring 14 times and scored in double figures 39 times in 65 career games at Virginia.

MITCHELL OFF TO FAST START

- Akil Mitchell has established career-high scoring efforts in each of the first two games.
- Mitchell tallied 11 points at George Mason and 12 vs. Fairfield. He is also tied for the team lead in rebounding with Harris at 7.5 per game.

NOTE WORTHY

- Virginia has outrebounded its opponents in each of the first two games.
- The Cavs held Fairfield to just 15 points in the second half.
- Virginia has trailed at the half in both games this season.

LONG RANGE BOMBERS

- Virginia is shooting 34.5% from three-point range this season.
- The Cavaliers made a season-high eight three-point shots at George Mason.
- Joe Harris (4), Evan Nolte (3), Paul Jespersion (1), Mike Tobey (1) and Taylor Barnette (1) have each connected from long range.

HOLDING FOES UNDER 50

- Virginia is 1-0 this season when holding opponents under 50 points.
- Last season, Virginia set an ACC record during the shot clock era by holding 11 opponents under 50 points last season.
- The 11 games of holding opponents under 50 points were the most for the Cavaliers in a season since holding 16 opponents under 50 points in 1945-46.
- Virginia has accomplished the feat 19 times in the Tony Bennett era.

70 IS A MAGIC NUMBER

- Under Tony Bennett, Virginia is 25-2 when scoring at least 70 points.
- The Cavaliers are 29-40 over the past four seasons when scoring under 70 points.

60 IS THE NEW 70

- The Cavaliers are 1-1 when scoring under 60 points and were 4-8 last season when scoring under 60 points.
- Last season, Virginia was 18-2 when scoring at least 60 points.

VIRGINIA PICKED 7TH IN THE ACC

- Virginia was selected seventh in the preseason poll at ACC Operation Basketball.
- The Cavaliers, who were picked fourth and finished fourth last season, have finished at or higher than their predicted finish in each of the last four seasons.
- NC State is the preseason favorite, followed by Duke, North Carolina, Florida State, Miami, Maryland, Virginia, Clemson, Georgia Tech, Virginia Tech, Wake Forest and Boston College.

ABOUT THE 2012-13 SCHEDULE

- Five of Virginia's opponents were ranked in the preseason polls (NC State, Duke, North Carolina, Wisconsin and Florida State), while another two received votes (Tennessee and Miami, Fla.).
- Six opponents earned 2012 NCAA Tournament berths, while three participated in the College Basketball Invitational and two in the National Invitation Tournament.

EUROPEAN TOUR RECAP

- The Cavaliers posted a 2-3 mark during their five-game European Tour this past August.
- UVa competed against teams from the Netherlands, Belgium and France. Joe Harris led Virginia in scoring in Europe, averaging 15.6 points per game, while Akil Mitchell averaged 13.4 ppg, Mike Tobey 11.2 ppg and Jontel Evans 9.6 ppg.
- Evans averaged 7.8 assists per games, while Mitchell was UVa's top rebounder, pulling down 50 boards in the five games.

Credentials that can't be mailed will be held for pickup at the will call window at John Paul Jones Arena. You must have a press pass to be admitted to the media area and the press room.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

All photographers and camera operators must wear a visible credential issued by the Virginia athletics media relations office. Photographers work from the baselines at both ends of the court at John Paul Jones Arena. Live television is given top priority for courtside space.

PRESS PARKING

Press parking passes are provided upon request on a limited basis. If you need a parking pass, please be sure to inform the UVa athletics media relations office when making your press or photo credential request.

INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Virginia basketball coaches and players should be made through Erich Bacher in the athletics media relations office. It is requested you allow the athletics media relations staff at least one day, preferably longer, to arrange an interview.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Virginia head coach Tony Bennett and the visiting head coach will meet with media representatives in the press room after each game at John Paul Jones Arena. The first coach will be available in the press room approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the game and the second coach will be in the press room approximately 20 minutes after the game. Virginia players will be available in the team meeting room adjacent to the men's basketball locker room after home games.

RADIO

Each visiting school is allowed one free radio broadcast from John Paul Jones Arena. The Virginia athletics media relations office provides two ISDN lines and three business touchtone lines for use by the visiting broadcast crew. Radio network crews work from a courtside location at the scorer's table. Three seats are available at the table and one seat behind the visitor's broadcast location.

GAME SERVICES

Information packets are available before each game at John Paul Jones Arena, and a full statistical summary and play-by-play sheets are distributed at halftime and after the game. Quotes from both coaches and two or three players from each team will be available at the conclusion of the game. A pregame meal is served for working members of the media in the press room on the event level of John Paul Jones Arena.

TELEPHONES/WIRELESS

The Virginia athletics media relations office will have a limited number of telephones available for postgame reporting. Should you require your own telephone for game coverage, please contact Darlene Craig or Jim Daves in the Virginia athletics media relations office. A wireless network is available at John Paul Jones Arena for visiting media. A UVa media relations representative will provide login directions.

SCOTT WILL BE MISSED

- UVa will miss the 2011-12 third-team All-American Mike Scott, who is now a member of the NBA's Atlanta Hawks.
- Scott, who led Virginia in scoring and rebounding last season, was the first Cavalier to earn All-America honors since Ralph Sampson in 1983.
- Scott totaled 1,538 points and 944 rebounds in 130 career games at UVa.

ON THE AIR THIS SEASON

- All of Virginia's games this season will be broadcast either on television or online this season. The only games that may not be broadcast are the NIT Season Tip-Off consolation games.
- All games will be broadcast on the Virginia Sports Radio Network with David Koehn (play-by-play) and Ted Jeffries (analyst) calling the action.

RECORDS WATCH

- Jontel Evans needs 25 assists and 25 steals to rank 10th on the UVa career lists. Joe Harris needs 37 three-pointers to rank 10th on the all-time career list.
