Five Things You Need to Know:

(1) UVA is ranked in the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls for the first time since Dec. 2, 2007. (2) This is the 29th AP poll conducted during head coach Mike London's tenure. This is the quickest into any UVA coach's time that the Cavaliers have cracked the rankings. (3) The last time UVA and Virginia Tech met for the Commonwealth Cup with both teams being ranked was the 2007 meeting in Scott Stadium. VPI was ranked No. 8 in the AP poll, while UVA was No. 16. (4) UVA's win at Florida State was the program's first in nine tries, also marking the first time the Cavaliers have picked up wins at Miami and FSU in the same season. (5) UVA's win at FSU was the program's first ACC road win while scoring 14 or fewer points since 1974. That win was at Wake Forest (14-0).
